It may be equally shocking to realize that our boundaries are also too narrow. This feast is an epiphany about God's will for Christ's impact and ours on the world.

Lord Jesus, you were born to a Jewish family in Bethlehem of Judea: Lord, have mercy. Christ Jesus, you came for the Jews, the Gentiles, and the whole world: Christ, have mercy. Lord Jesus, you call us to open our hearts to all people: Lord, have mercy.




There will be no daily Mass from Thursday January 11 thru Tuesday January 16. I will be visiting family, a trip I had to postpone last January when my health required me to stay home.


