In the long run, Moses might have summed up the criteria for discernment of prophets by admitting that his vocation was not his idea, but Godgiven for the sake of others and repeating "A prophet like me will the Lord, your God, raise up for you."

Please consider a pledge of \$187 over a six month period. \$32 per month – the Diocese will send you a reminder each month.






