Thank you for your generosity for our Catholic Home Missions 2nd collection last weekend. We received \$3,873.





Whether your child loves Spiderman, Batman, Captain America, Wonder Woman, or just likes using their imagination there is something here for every superhero fan. We will complete activities faster than a speeding bullet while leaping over tall buildings in a single bound! Your little super heroes will have a ball! What's your superpower? Teacher: Mrs. Bright Smith
- Week 6: July 22-26: Splish! Splash! This week we will focus on all kinds of fun with water! The children will conduct experiments with sinking and floating objects, explore freezing and melting ice, paint with ice, make boats, explore ocean wave bottles, learn about ocean animals, and have much fun getting wet and playing water games.
