


23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time September 8, 2019



REFLECTION

Pope Francis this week visits Mozambique, Madagascar and Mauritius. Finding those countries may lead us to search for some sort of atlas. In Africa, Pope Francis has already been to Egypt, Kenya, Uganda, the Central African Republic, and Morocco.

Mozambique a country still recovering from the devastating effects of Cyclone Idai - one of the worst tropical cyclones on record to have hit Africa and the Southern Hemisphere. A month after Cyclone Idai, in April this year, Cyclone Kenneth also made landfall in the northern region of the country causing significant damage and loss of life.

Madagascar is a big island nation famous for its Vanilla production and is situated off the southeast coast of Africa. Madagascar gained independence from France in 1960, but its people are fatigued by endless political instability and disputed elections that have sometimes turned violent. The country is also rich in natural resources and boasts of a flourishing tourism industry

Mauritius has a strong correlation between religious affiliation and ethnicity. Citizens of Indian, Pakistani or Bangladeshi origin tend to be predominantly Hindu or Muslim. Those of Chinese ancestry generally practice Buddhism, Anglicanism, or Catholicism. Creoles (persons of African descent) and citizens of European descent are primarily Catholic.

When Pope Francis began his trip this past week he invited everyone to pray for the victims of Hurricane Dorian, which thrashed the Bahamas.

Pope Francis acknowledged the devastation wrecked so far by Hurricane Dorian in his greetings to journalists aboard the papal plane. "Those poor people," he said, "who from one day to the next have lost their homes, everything, even their lives."

A little background on Edge retreats.....The retreats are designed to help your teen develop a more personal and intimate relationship with Jesus. I am going to make a bold statement and quote one of my favorite authors, Sherry Weddell. "The majority of Catholics in the US are sacramentalized but not evangelized. They do not know that an explicit, personal attachment to Christ - personal discipleship - is normative Catholicism as taught by the apostles and reiterated time and time again by the popes, councils and saints of the Church." This is exactly what the Edge retreat is designed to do. We will have over 15 Level C chaperons, a ratio of 5:1 in small groups. The teens will stay in one large building with separate wings by gender. There will be adult chaperons in every wing. All meals are provided and the kitchen is capable of taking care of basic food allergies. The weekend consists of songs, skits, fellowship and fun. I am beyond thrilled to say that this year we have Harriet Scott returning to us as the retreat hostess with the mostest. And we've hired a top notch young Catholic musician, John Finch to lead us in praise and worship throughout the weekend. We are so excited to have them join us this year. This will be a chance for your teen to build relationships with not only new friends but the core team as well. We travel by bus and will load at 5:00pm with a departure at 5:30 Friday returning home around 1:30/1:45 Sunday where we will celebrate mass in the chapel as soon as we arrive. 


