

Some words from Archbishop Patrick Pinder of Nassau Bahama after Hurricane Dorian passed through: "I spoke about the hurricane, then invited the people to come up for a blessing and we spent some time in quiet prayer commending to God the many who perished in the storm. It has been a horrific experience, many of them lost dwellings, some of them lost all their possessions; going through a Category 5 hurricane is something not too many of us have experienced.

It is sheer terror and confusion for those who had their homes compromised in the middle of the storm and had to relocate, and all the challenges that poses, and then be taken to places where there were large crowds of people. Many of the stories are stories of terror, fear, pain, loss.

We are thinking now of the long-term efforts and that we will need a huge amount of assistance in dealing with this from other entities and agencies with more capacity and experience.

We live in a hurricane zone in the Bahamas and as a consequence we must always prepare, but preparing alone is not going to stop hurricanes from coming our way nor does it stop the degree of damage hurricanes can do — but preparing certainly prepares us to be in a better position to respond afterwards.

Caring, of course, is what we must do when so many of those around us have been so severely harmed by hurricane such as Hurricane Dorian.

At this time, it is most important for us to remain unified to show our solidarity, our fraternity and care for each other. We rely on the grace of the Holy Spirit to give us the wisdom, the peace of mind and the strength to make it through this most difficult time in the history of our nation.

A little background on Edge retreats.....The retreats are designed to help your teen develop a more personal and intimate relationship with Jesus. They do not know that an explicit, personal attachment to Christ - personal discipleship - is normative Catholicism as taught by the apostles and reiterated time and time again by the popes, councils and saints of the Church." This is exactly what the Edge retreat is designed to do. We will have over 15 Level C chaperons, a ratio of 5:1 in small groups. The teens will stay in one large building with separate wings by gender. There will be adult chaperons in every wing. All meals are provided and the kitchen is capable of taking care of basic food allergies. The weekend consists of songs, skits, fellowship and fun. I am beyond thrilled to say that this year we have Harriet Scott returning to us as the retreat hostess with the mostest. And we've hired a top notch young Catholic musician, John Finch to lead us in praise and worship throughout the weekend. We are so excited to have them join us this year. This will be a chance for your teen to build relationships with not only new friends but the core team as well. We travel by bus and will load at 5:00pm with a departure at 5:30 Friday returning home around 1:30/1:45 Sunday where we will celebrate mass in the chapel as soon as we arrive.
