Saint Florence [Florentina] lived in Spain and was the sister of three brothers who are saints — Saint Leander, Saint Fulgentius and Saint Isidore, Doctor of the Church. She became a nun and an abbess and died in the same Her feast day is June 20. year as her great brother, Saint Isidore. She died about 612.

St. Florence is also a church in Wales that dates back to Norman times, and remains of 16th and 17th century buildings still exist, with Flemish chimneys, characteristic of Pembrokeshire, named after Flemish settlers in the region.




