Report from Diocese Parishes Affected by Hurricane

Annunciation, Havelock – Tree through the roof of the school
Our Lady of Guadalupe, Newton Grove – Interior water damage to the rectory from the windows and attic.

Sacred Heart, Southport – Extensive water damage in the sacristy cabinet, tiles, and carpeting, damage to tiles in the common area.

St. Therese, Wrightsville Beach – Water damage to the buildings and some roof damage, damaged fences and a/c units.

St. Brendan, Shallotte – Several leaks and some interior ceiling damage and some wind damaged gutters.

St. Patrick, Fayetteville – 4 feet of water in rectory basement, sump pump failed, interior damage to church, school, gym, office

St. Mary, Wilmington – Flooding in the lower school and possibly the gym. Some large trees down, but not on buildings.

Sacred Heart, Pinehurst – Wind damage to roof, interior water damage to the church.

St. Ann, Fayetteville – Parish was in evacuation zone. Awaiting results of the rising waters.

St. Mark, Wilmington – Church roof failed and major water leaks, including one by the main electrical panel

St. Paul, New Bern – 2 feet of water in the Family Life Center, church had roof leaks. Tree on top of rectory but no apparent damage.

St. Egbert, Morehead City – Roof and water damage to the offices, some to a new small addition to the school and roof and water damage to the rectory – pastor cannot stay there.

Infant of Prague, Jacksonville – Church is OK. Gym had a large part of the roof torn off. Interior water damage.

Cathedral – Standing water in both eastward vestibules on each transept on the north and south. Dripping onto the ceiling drywall.

Avila Retreat Center – Tree branch through the roof of Cottage G.

Short Journey Center – Roof damage, interior water damage
