A Note From Father Donald Staib

This week is Catholic Schools Week. We wish a happy week to all our students, parents, and teaching staff. This Spring we will graduate our 19th class. The old Yearbooks show how they looked back in our beginning.

Today we begin the Bishop's Annual Appeal. I have found the parish most responsive to the routine we had used for quite a few years. At the beginning of the sermon ushers will pass out pledged forms which can later be placed in the collection. Our goal this year is \$191,507. Doing the math - to meet our goal we ask a pledge of \$187 from each parish household.

We have received \$10,650 from 39 households. This year reporting will be delayed because of extra security precautions the diocese is taking with your donations.

This week also there will be a 2^{nd} Collection. This is an annual collection for the church in Latin America.

CONFESSIONS: There will be Confessions Saturday January 26, after Baptisms and on Saturday February 2.

BAPTISMS - See the Guidelines on the Website - then email the Pastor. First time parents must attend a baptism class [a good time is during the 9 months prior to birth.] Baptisms are usually, not always, at 10am on Saturdays or at weekend Masses. Baptisms are not encouraged during Lent which begins on March 6 this year. Baptisms are welcome at the Easter Sunday Masses.

CONFESSIONS - Always check the Pastor's Paragraph in the weekly Bulletin or our E-News mailed on Fridays. Confessions are usually, but not every week, at 10:30am on Saturdays in the Church.

WEDDINGS - See the Guidelines on the Website - then email the Pastor.

SINCERELY WRONG

One of our great challenges is confronting someone who is sincere, but sincerely wrong. People's absolute belief in the rightness of what they're doing is what makes it so difficult to change minds or offer correction.

Here are some steps to follow: 1) Be Gracious. Very often you'll find that in their zealotry and passion, people can be rude and disrespectful. 2) Keep to the facts. No matter what they say, don't let personal emotions, frustration, or anger color the discussion. 3) You have to read between the lines. Be ready for some pretty crazy statements. 4) Help them save face. Remember that fear of failure is a powerful drug. 

Elementary Faith Formation



Welcome Dinner




