A Note From Father Donald Staib

This weekend is our Lent Parish Mission. We welcome Father Chris Ortega, Father Jared Cooke, and worship leader John Finch to our parish. The two priests will be here for the Sunday Masses for the Mission - and Msgr. Gerald Lewis will be here for the 5 pm Mass.

I am grateful to our Youth Staff, Liz Sams and Janine McGann, who have made all the arrangements for this event for our parish during Lent. I will be away on the weekend, but will return on Monday afternoon.

On Fridays during Lent there will be Stations of the Cross in church at 7 pm. I am grateful that a group of people have come forth to lead the Stations.

Regarding the Bishop's Annual Appeal - last weekend we received \$1,351 from 8 new pledges. Thank you very much. We have surpassed our goal by \$7,604. So far we have about 35% parish participation and \$197,581 had been given by 627 households. Gift/Pledge forms are in the pew racks.

CONFESSIONS: In another part of the bulletin there is a schedule for Confessions at nearby parishes during Lent. At St Mary Magdalene there will not be Confessions on Saturday March 16 - nor on March 23 because there is a wedding. Thank you to all who helped with our own parish Penance Service this past Thursday.

BAPTISMS - See the Guidelines on the Website - then email the Pastor. First time parents must attend a baptism class [a good time is during the 9 months prior to birth.] Baptisms are usually, not always, at 10am on Saturdays or at weekend Masses.

CONFESSIONS - Always check the Pastor's Paragraph in the weekly Bulletin or our E-News mailed on Fridays. Confessions are usually, but not every week, at 10:30am on Saturdays in the Church.

WEDDINGS - See the Guidelines on the Website - then email the Pastor.

Reflection

As the term itself implies peak experiences do not come often and they do not last. But they can become a touchstone, a marker to which we may return mentally and spiritually at various points in our lives. The birth of a child, failing in love, a special day, or an encounter in nature may all be peak experiences we want to preserve, remember, and cherish.

Perhaps like Peter we want to 'build a tent,' or otherwise make a memorial to the event and the person[s] with whom we shared it. But like the events in today's Gospel, as soon as the incident happens, it seems to end. 'After the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone.' The encounter of the transfiguration informs our own peak experiences. They are a taste of the life that is to come, an eternal peak experience that satisfies all longings.

Letter about Email Scam



MEMO

TO: **Priests and Pastoral Administrators** Kevin Hemphill, IT Services

RE: Scam Warning, Note of Caution for Diocesan Email Users

A note of caution for email users on all email systems across the Roman Catholic Diocese of Raleigh: Please distribute this information by email to your parishioners email lists and post in your bulletins.

Some nefarious international con artists are establishing and using email accounts, such as G-Mail, in the name of some of our priests and, most recently, in the name of our bishop. They are doing this to illicitly solicit gift cards, money or information.

Kindly consider this as a scam and do not respond under any circumstances.

Our diocesan IT staff is working to address this invasion of privacy and the attempted fraud against the goodness of our parish communities

To ensure your protection, if you receive a request from one of our priests or our bishop, please verify it is not a scam by speaking directly to them, or their appropriate staff, through known phone numbers and known email addresses. Please, never reply to such an email directly, nor call any numbers provided in such an email directly.

Below is are examples of these types of scams. NOTE: There other are variations:

Columbarium

Choices:

The STMM Columbarium has nearly 100 of the 552 niches reserved. Most of them are reserved as doubles so nearly 200 of STMM parishioners have chosen the STMM Columbarium as their final resting place. Depending on the number of attendees funeral masses have been held in either the Church or the Chapel. Inurnments have immediately followed the funeral Mass, allowing the family to gather and pay their final respects.

There are two niches that have been set-aside for youth deaths. These are common niches meant to provide families a reverent place for their loved ones on either a temporary or permanent basis. The Knights of Columbus are supporting families that experience a youth death with their prayers along with an urn at no cost.

A change is up coming on niche pricing effective 1 July 2019. If you know you are interested in a niche within the STMM Columbarium, you may want to consider completing the process prior to 1 July 2019. Columbarium guidelines are on-line @ www.StMM.church/welcome/Columbarium.cfm
Current availability of niches as well as the process of obtaining a niche are also at this link. Information cards are also on the tables in the narthex of the Church. The recommend urn is available for ordering at a significant discount over retail pricing. You also have the option to store the urn in your niche until needed.

A Columbarium information session will be held in Meeting Room 1 after mass on Mar 30-31, 2019 to provide additional information.
