Reflection

Considerations for an Ethical Discernment Regarding Some Aspects of the Present Economic-Financial System

I. Introduction

Economic and financial issues draw our attention today as never before because of the growing influence of financial markets on the material well-being of most of humankind. What is needed, on the one hand, is an appropriate regulation of the dynamics of the markets and, on the other hand, a clear ethical foundation that assures a well-being realized through the quality of human relationships rather than merely through economic mechanisms that by themselves cannot attain it. This ethical foundation needs to inform a range of persons but especially those working in the fields of economy and finance. In this situation a synthesis of technical knowledge and human wisdom is essential. Without such a synthesis, every human activity tends to deteriorate. But where it exists, it can foster progress towards the integral and concrete well-being of the human person.

Mission Trip to Haiti

We have 165 of the 300 students in Haiti sponsored! Thank you to those of you who have generously donated. If you haven't donated yet, please watch the video (link below) to see what our parish & school are hoping to accomplish for these 2 schools in Haiti. A \$25 donation covers the cost of 1 year in school!

During the week of April 8th the STMM Youth Ministers, Janine McGann and Liz Sams participated in a mission trip to Jeremie, Haiti through Haiti Missions Inc (<http://www.haitimissioninc.com>)

Hurricane Matthew hit the region of Jeremie during October 2016 causing extensive damage to homes, churches and school as well as killing over 1000 people. The extent of the poverty in this area is beyond anything we had ever experienced before. Haiti Missions Inc. is committed to providing housing, education and hope to the people of Jeremie & one way they have done that is by opening 2 Catholic schools in the area. They are in danger of closing because the families cannot afford to pay the tuition which costs each student \$25 per year. Yes, that is correct! \$25 covers an entire year of education in Haiti! The \$25 per year covers all their costs and provides each student with one meal a day, many times it is the only meal that child will eat that day. We felt called to come back to our STMM school & church community and raise a rally cry to help get the 300 students of these 2 schools sponsored. Please watch this video and prayerfully consider sponsoring these children. All the research shows that education is the #1 weapon to battle poverty.

Let's not let these schools close on our watch!
