Reflection

"The most important word in Catholic social teaching is 'and'," John Carr said on Friday during a talk at the Fall Conference at the University of Notre Dame, put together each year by the Center for Ethics and Culture. "Human life and human dignity; human rights and responsibility; the dignity to work and the rights for workers; care for creation and care for the least of us; solidarity and the subsidiarity Catholics."

"The way to overcome polarization is to understand that 'and' is at the core of our tradition," Carr said.


