A Note From Father Donald Staib

Our 2nd collection for the Missions last week was \$7,130. That is about two times the amount we usually receive. Thank you for this generosity.

And also our parish is grateful for the additional gifts members have made to the offertory and paying for the new church. We have not asked for an increase in offertory since seeking pledges for the new church. But now it is time to ask - the operating costs of the church are larger and we would like to consider our staffing needs as we grow. Our membership has increased by 300 families in the past year.

On All Saints Day, November 1, this Thursday - which is a holy day - Masses will be with the school children at 8:15 in the morning and in the evening at 7 pm. Msgr. John Wall will be the priest for the Thursday morning Mass.

CONFESSIONS: There will not be Confessions on Saturday October 27. [A wedding will keep the pastor busy]. The next Saturday 10:30 am Confessions will be Saturday, November 3.

BAPTISMS - See the Guidelines on the Website - then email the Pastor. First time parents must attend a baptism class [a good time is during the 9 months prior to birth.] Baptisms are usually, not always, at 10am on Saturdays or at weekend Masses.

CONFESSIONS - Always check the Pastor's Paragraph in the weekly Bulletin or our E-News mailed on Fridays. Confessions are usually, but not every week, at 10:30am on Saturdays in the Church.

WEDDINGS - See the Guidelines on the Website - then email the Pastor.
