My friends went off to visit others before returning to Morehead City when the danger passed. They were fortunate in that their homes and business were only slightly affected. Bless our Knights of Columbus who have arranged for trucks to bring supplies to those affected.

We will take a 2nd collection today; the funds will be distributed though Catholic Charities. Suggested other gifts - you can leave at the church front doors anytime and we will have them picked up:

ONLY NONPERISHABLE ITEMS - NO CLOTHES OR FURNITURE
Food and Water --- Baby Items - diapers, wipes
Cleaning supplies, paper towels, bleach spray cleaner
Toiletries - toilet paper, soap, tooth paste, brushes, shampoo, shaving
Gift Cards - gas and grocery [put in Sunday collection]
Checks made out to StMM - mark for Hurricane Florence

BAPTISMS - See the Guidelines on the Website - then email the Pastor. First time parents must attend a baptism class [a good time is during the 9 months prior to birth.] Baptisms are usually, not always, at 10am on Saturdays or at weekend Masses.

CONFESSIONS - Always check the Pastor's Paragraph in the weekly Bulletin or our E-News mailed on Fridays. Confessions are usually, but not every week, at 10:30am on Saturdays in the Church.

Letter from Bishop Zarama



MEMO

TO: Pastors and Pastoral Administrators

FROM: +Luis Rafael Zarama, Bishop of Raleigh

RE: Hurricane Florence Impact and Second Collection

Dear Brother Priests,

In recent days, we have all seen the heartbreaking photographs and video reports of those who have been impacted so severely by the wind, rain, and flooding caused by Hurricane Florence. I ask that you and your parishioners pray for those who have lost their lives, those who have been injured, and for those who have lost homes and possessions. I also ask for prayers for the brave first responders who have been so helpful in the rescue and relief efforts.

This is a time for our Catholic community to come together and to assist our neighbors in North Carolina who are in most need. I ask that you offer your parishioners the opportunity to contribute to a special collection for hurricane relief, ideally the weekend of September 29th and 30th, or at a date that is most convenient for your parish.

Funds from this special collection will be used by Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Raleigh to respond to this and other disasters of this nature in eastern North Carolina. The funds will be used to establish points of distribution which will supply food, water, and basic supplies to families throughout impacted areas, to provide direct financial assistance to help families access safe and stable housing, to compassionately serve those impacted by this traumatic event, and to support long term NC Catholics Volunteer disaster recovery projects.

So that the totality of the Diocesan response can be known, I ask that you send funds from the special collection to the Diocesan business office, with a notation that the funds are for Hurricane Florence relief. The Diocese will provide periodic updates on the amount collected and about relief and recovery activities undertaken by Catholic Charities with these funds.


