Last week in the 2nd collection for those affected by Hurricane Florence we received \$22,099. A wonderful generosity! We will forward these funds to Catholic Charities to use to help people.

Last Tuesday I visited some friends on the coast and on the drive back and forth saw some of the effects of the Hurricane in Jacksonville, Morehead City, Havelock, New Bern, and Kinston. Most of the destruction I saw was a result of flooding. It is so sad to see people's belongings: beds, sofas, chairs on the highway awaiting pickup for trash. I also saw trucks of cleanup equipment, many with license tags from faraway places such as Michigan and Kansas.

Reflection

Interview of Archbishop of Riga, Latvia, Zbignevs Stankevičs [before visit by Pope Francis]

In this historic moment for Europe, nationalist feelings are resurrecting in many of the continent's countries. Is this true for Latvia? But nationalism, in your opinion, is always to be condemned?

It depends on what the contents of this concept of "nationalism" are. From my point of view, I would distinguish "patriotism" and "nationalism"; the former is good, the second is not, although some experts argue that there are various levels of nationalism, and the "softer" ones can be accepted. I say this: love for one's own homeland is something necessary, it is part of the fourth commandment, "Honor thy father and mother": but with nationalism we already get to feel a sense of superiority towards others, and this it is not acceptable.




The wedding of Kenneth Oliva and Dana Feldner on Saturday, September 22nd. Kenneth was an Altar Server in our gym Mass days.
