St. Thomas is holding a carpenters rule - he was a builder of churches in India and there is a tradition he also went to Sri Lanka. May all our prayers be with those who suffered from the terror last week. Bombing is not a message St Thomas would bring when he preached the Gospel.

And for ourselves we pray to insight and understanding as Thomas received directly from the Lord.

BAPTISMS - See the Guidelines on the Website - then email the Pastor. First time parents must attend a baptism class [a good time is during the 9 months prior to birth.] Baptisms are usually, not always, at 10am on Saturdays or at weekend Masses.

CONFESSIONS - Always check the Pastor's Paragraph in the weekly Bulletin or our E-News mailed on Fridays. Confessions are usually, but not every week, at 10:30am on Saturdays in the Church.

WEDDINGS - See the Guidelines on the Website - then email the Pastor.
