At Masses last weekend I used the words 'we have it good and I know it.' I had not actually put the words in my notes, but they came to me spontaneously. Maybe the Holy Spirit is telling me to be more grateful for the blessings we enjoy and to realize there are many less fortunate in our world.

Last weekend we had one of our national and annual collections, this time for the Home Missions. We received \$3,129; many thanks.

This weekend we will take a non-scheduled 2^{nd} collection for those people in Ecuador who have suffered from the earthquakes. Earthquakes are among the most frightening events in people's lives. I have seen recent reports of the suffering that continues in Nepal. People still do not have homes to return to.
