# **Philippine Missionary Religious Article Sales**



Sr. Irene from the Mary Queen of Heaven Missionaries of Cebu, Philippines will be here the weekend of Nov. 19-20 to ask your help and support in their mission of rescuing women and children from prostitution and human trafficking in the Philippines. They shelter and rehabilitate these women and children whom they have rescued through their center called "Home of Love". Programs and services are given free of charge including shelter, food, counseling, spiritual formation, education, skills training, child care and re-integration programs. They are appealing to us and desperately need our help to support their program in fighting prostitution through education by sponsoring poor children who can't afford to go to school. The cost to send a child to school is \$25 a month or \$300 for one year. Their community has successfully helped rescue thousands of these children from the possibility of human trafficking and prostitution in the Philippines. Sr. Irene will be in the lobby with her religious items that were made in the Philippines. By purchasing these religious items you can help support their mission and can help stop Human Trafficking. ## **Reflection - November 13, 2016**

Remarks from Cardinal-designate Joseph W. Tobin on his appointment as the Archbishop of Newark, N.J.

I believe that the Church in every age is challenged to reproduce the double miracle that accompanied her birth at Pentecost. The first miracle is dramatic: on the day of Pentecost, people from many lands heard the Good News proclaimed by the apostles, each in his or her own language. This miracle produced an abundant response of faith.

The second miracle is understated but nonetheless wonderfully real. There is no evidence that the response of faith erased the richness of culture. The Parthians, Medes, Elamites and all those other tongue-twisting nationalities did not "melt" into some celestial "pot." The first Christians retained the richness of their cultures while discovering a principle of unity. This principle is nothing less than the Holy Spirit.

I grew up in a multi-cultural neighborhood of southwest Detroit. I was a little jealous of classmates that went home and spoke a different language, ate different food, thought differently. My service of the Church obliged me to live many years in cultures different from the Irish-American ambient of my family. So I am excited to lead an archdiocese where the Eucharist is celebrated each Sunday in twenty languages. The Holy Spirit will help

us prolong the double miracle of Pentecost.
