Recent Gospels in St Luke have been about our money and possessions. All parishes have to deal with this topic. Please note in another part of the bulletin and in our e-news how we at St. Mary Magdalene use our resources. We ask all to consider whether it is time to increase our giving.

During October - November each year for the weekend Masses I often use different Eucharistic Prayers at Mass. I am not sure they are in the Missals people use. There are 4 of them and I rotate them from week to week. I did find them online under the words 'Eucharistic Prayers for Various Needs.'

This week is National Vocations Awareness Week. We pray for our seminarians and we pray for priests everywhere. May the Lord bless us with priests and with dedicated pastoral workers.

Sacraments



BAPTISMS - See the Guidelines on the Website - then email the Pastor. First time parents must attend a baptism class [a good time is during the 9 months prior to birth.] Baptisms are usually, not always, at 10am on Saturdays or at weekend Masses.

CONFESSIONS - Always check the Pastor's Paragraph in the weekly Bulletin or our E-News mailed on Fridays. Confessions are usually, but not every week, at 10:30am on Saturdays in the Church.

WEDDINGS - See the Guidelines on the Website - then email the Pastor.

Reflection

Here is a major theme of St Luke's Gospel: the right use of wealth. Here are some examples: Prodigal Son, Rich Man and Lazarus, Dishonest Steward. The story of Zacchaeus today is about Jesus' interaction with a wealthy chief tax collector.

Jesus does not tell him to sell all his possessions and give to the poor. That commandment is reserved for only one person, the young man whose sole love of possessions prevented him from following Jesus

No, Zacchaeus does not receive that command. This story is about how we use our money, resources, and possessions. Do we share?

Money Matters

The Pharisee in the Gospel of October 27 gave to the Temple 10% of his income. The Tax collector in the November 3 Gospel gave $\frac{1}{2}$ of his possessions to the poor. How are we doing at St Mary Magdalene?

Since July 1 2019 our Offertory is about \$10,000 per month short of our budget for 2019-2020. We know some folks choose to give once a year, toward the end of the year. We also hope the 212 new households we have since last January will help us reach our parish needs.

Here is a snapshot of giving patterns since January 2019:

20 families have given between \$6,000 and \$20,000

95 families have given between \$3,000 and \$5,999

459 families have given between \$1,000 and \$2,999

349 families have given between \$500 and \$999

474 families have given between \$100 and \$499

207 families have given less than \$100

433 families have no record of giving

[We have written to most of these 433 families to ask if they are still here and wish to continue to be members of StMM.]

We also have come to realize that some members who made a pledge to the new church will not be completing their pledge. This amounts to \$73,000.

We are so grateful to all who use the White Envelopes; we use these funds to pay our debt for the construction. Blessings to all who help our parish like the Pharisee and the Tax Collector in the Gospels.


