An example of money and construction: this past week we paid Clancy and Theys Construction Co. \$450,000 for the month's work. That payment will use up the last of our savings. From now on the funds will come from our allowed borrowing. You can see having cash right now would be most helpful.

In recent weeks we have received new pledges and gifts from old and new members of the parish, and some of those who gave in the past years have increased their gifts beyond what they had original pledged.

As I write in this week's bulletin: I offer my personal thanks to all who made donations in recent weeks - new givers and those who added to a pledge they already made. The Chapel is important to me because it is so helpful when we have funerals. I can do them in our own home parish, St Mary Magdalene, and not have to run around looking for places.

Another grateful note: thanks for the wonderful generous response last weekend for those who have suffered from the floods in Louisiana - we received \$5,736; that is a huge amount for a 2nd collection.

Reflection on This Week's Gospel

Big life decisions require calculated thought. We calculate the gains and losses of selling our home. We calculate the positives and negatives of accepting a new job. We calculate the strength and weaknesses of each candidate when voting. 'Great crowds' were

following Jesus. Did people have any inkling of the cost? Did they remain a great crowd or become drifters?

Faced with calculating the cost of discipleship, do we choose to be part of Jesus' faithful companions on the journey, or do we choose to become drifters? We are Jesus's faithful companions when we take the necessary steps to forgive someone who has seriously hurt us or stay the course of living with less so those with little can have what they need. We drift away from Jesus when we follow the path of least resistance in face of an unjust situation or we insist on our own way despite the needs of others in our family or workplace. The cost of discipleship is this choice: to be Jesus' companions - or drifters.

Words of Pope Francis

A few words from Pope Francis' message for the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, September 1, 2016

The Christian life involves the practice of the traditional seven corporal and seven spiritual works of mercy. We usually think of the works of mercy individually and in relation to a specific initiative: hospitals for the sick, soup kitchens for the hungry, shelters for the homeless, schools for those to be educated, the confessional and spiritual direction for those needing counsel and forgiveness.

But if we look at the works of mercy as a whole, we see that the object of mercy is human life itself and everything it embraces.

Obviously "human life itself and everything it embraces" includes care for our common home. So let me propose a complement to the two traditional sets of seven: may the works of mercy also include care for our common home.

As a spiritual work of mercy, care for our common home calls for a grateful contemplation of God's world which allows us to discover in each thing a teaching which God wishes to hand on to us. As a corporal work of mercy, care for our common home requires simple daily gestures which break with the logic of violence, exploitation and selfishness and makes itself felt in every action that seeks to build a better world.
