# A NOTE ABOUT THE PROPHET AMOS

[Amos will be our Old Testament guide for two weeks]

For a contemporary reader living in a postmodern cyber age, Amos' context and message may seem far removed. How are we to relate to a message given so long ago, in the context of an agrarian society? There are certain key points worthy of note: Amos is noteworthy for its understanding and analysis of his contemporary society and its issues. Amos does not resort to abstractions. His critique is grounded in the reality of suffering that affected the majority of the population. Amos is concerned with: does everyone have just and equitable access to the economic base? This is a fundamental question that can be posed irrespective of time, place, and society.

## **Knights of Columbus Blood Drive**

I am writing to all parishioners today to talk about our past blood drives and ask for your opinion about future blood drives. The Knights of Columbus have sponsored the **"Blood Drive"** for the last several years and they have been held on a Saturday. Our donors have averaged 25 to 30 pints but those numbers have decreased in the last year to 10 to 15 pints average. The cost of hosting a Blood Drive correlates into 30 pints according to UNC Rex. Consequently, to host a drive, we need your help in getting the participation

about 30 pints. As you may or may not know, for every pint of blood donated we save three lives. So, if we as a parish donate 30 pints, we will have saved 90 lives.

Donating takes about two hours out of your schedule. I am very aware of everyone's busy lives; however, in my four years as a member of this parish, I am astounded at the generosity in time and talent. That brings me to my question for all members of the parish: Would you prefer to donate on Saturday, November 5<sup>th</sup> or Sunday, November 13<sup>th</sup>?
