A Note From Father Donald Staib

My Friends,

This week we celebrate Corpus Christi, the feast of the Holy Eucharist. It is the most meaningful part of the Mass when we gather together, which we cannot do right now.

America Magazine asked its readers 'What do you miss about church that surprises you?' A reader responded: 'It surprises me how much I miss all of it. Even trying to find a seat, crying babies, unexciting homilies. Of course I miss the Mass and the Eucharist, but the others surprise me.'

Another reader wrote: 'Having Sunday be a different experience than any other day. It has disrupted our lives in a way that feels something is terribly amiss. We had to do something about it. Even though we livestream Mass and keep Sunday holy, we had to change a routine in our family. We now bake homemade bread Saturday evening. We wake up to homemade bread, a different breakfast than every other day.'

We have resumed daily Mass, now at 9:15. Thank you to all who have adjusted to the changes we had to make.

Those who wish to attend are asked to wear a mask. Since I am in a higher end age group a younger person will give Communion and there will be hand sanitizing available.

Use your best judgment about coming to daily Mass.

This week and next week, June 21, we will continue to offer Communion after the live streamed 10:45 Mass. We evaluate each week how we can move forward, depending on Guidelines from our Governor and our Bishop.

I send my prayers to you in these stressful days.

CONFESSIONS - There will be Confessions on Saturday June 13 at 10:30. I will be outside by the Chapel doors, unless weather makes it necessary to go inside.

Reflection

Spaghetti Alla Carbonara

1 lb spaghetti $\frac{1}{2}$ lb bacon, diced 2 tbs white wine 4 eggs beaten 4 oz grated pecorino sea salt fresh ground black pepper

Place a pot of salted water onto boil. Cook the spaghetti in the salted water until al dente. Meanwhile dice the bacon and cook until crisp in a large pan over medium heat. Drain off only half the bacon grease. Add the white wine.

In a bowl, whisk the eggs, the grated pecorino cheese, pepper and salt. Set aside until the pasta is cooked.

Drain the spaghetti and add to the pan of bacon. Mix well. Remove the pan from the heat. Add the egg and cheese mixture to the pan, and stir vigorously. Mix until the eggs begin to bind. Season to taste, distribute on individual plates, and serve. Serves 4.

Distribution of Communion

Hello StMM parishioners,

Until we can gather together as a community again inside the church, we are obligated to abide by the guidelines set forth by both the Governor of NC and the Bishop of Raleigh. Our plan for this Sunday, June 14th and June 21st is to continue live streaming the 10:45am Mass and on our <u>YouTube channel</u>. This week we also invite you to come to the church after the 10:45 Mass to receive Communion. This will begin about 11:45.

The assumption is you will have watched the live stream Mass & then come to church where we will be distributing Communion. Please drive to StMM, park your car, and proceed on foot to one of the Communion stations. We will give Communion until all have received, until 12:15.


Extraordinary Ministers will be located in different locations to distribute Communion. There will be 9 stations located around the church & school property (please see the map which has the marked spots and the flow for foot traffic)

We have never done anything like this before so we please request that you show great patience, respect social distancing guidelines, & remain reverent.

If inclement weather should occur, please check the website at www.stmm.net for updated information.

- 1. Please see the overhead image of St. Mary Magdalene Church for the marked distribution stations located around the property and notice the direction you should follow while waiting to receive.
- 2. There will be a station under the drive thru portico on the chapel side of the church for anyone who meets the following criteria: Parishioners over the age of 60, anyone in the medically high risk population, & those who require a gluten free host. In the drive thru please stay in your car to receive the Eucharist.
- 3. According to the CDC guidelines, each person is asked to wear a mask
- 4. Ushers will be on hand with hand sanitizer at each line. Please sanitize your hands prior to receiving the Eucharist.
- 5. We ask you not to receive the Eucharist on the tongue, only in the hand. Please extend your hands in a flattened manner stacked one on top of the other.
- 6. After receiving Communion please return to your vehicle and exit the property safely
- 7. Do not engage in casual conversation before or after receiving, please remain prayerful as you would in church.
- 8. Because of Father Staib's age he is advised not to distribute Commmunion to large crowds

We miss gathering together and look forward to when we can be united again under one roof.

Resuming Sacraments of Confession and Baptism

CONFESSIONS

This Saturday, June 13 there will be Confessions at 10:30 am.

I will wear a mask and ask that you do the same.

If the weather is comfortable I will be outside in the piazza.

If weather is not favorable to outside -

- I will sit in a pew near the Baptism Font
- Penitent will sit in a chair
- Those waiting in line stay in the lobby until you turn
- Leave church after Confession

BAPTISMS

There are 31 awaiting Baptism and I can have only 1 family at a time. Maximum to attend is 9 people.

I will wear a mask when close to the child and parent who holds child should have a mask. Others who attend are encouraged to wear a mask.

At this time I can schedule a Baptism only through the month of June. There are no Saturday opportunities available; we have 2 couples striving to arrange a wedding in June.

I can have Baptisms at other times. I suggest 4pm or 5pm on weekdays. Families can email me donfs22@aol.com to check alternate days/times.

Sacraments



BAPTISMS - See the Guidelines on the Website - then email the Pastor. First time parents must attend a baptism class [a good time is during the 9 months prior to birth.] Baptisms are usually, not always, at 10am on Saturdays or at weekend Masses.

CONFESSIONS - Always check the Pastor's Paragraph in the weekly Bulletin or our E-News mailed on Fridays. Confessions are usually, but not every week, at 10:30am on Saturdays in the Church.

WEDDINGS - See the Guidelines on the Website - then email the Pastor.

OUR NEW CHURCH - We have the obligation to make large monthly payments for 13 years for the construction of the church. In addition we are challenged to respond to new parish endeavors in all our parish programs. We are grateful to those who help us in the weekly Offertory for regular expenses and in the monthly white envelope for debt payments for the church.

Faith Formation Programs

Creating a Plan for Re-Opening our Parish Programs

As we move toward the goal of reopening this fall, we'd like to continue the relational aspect as the cornerstone of our parish youth programs. Maintaining our sense of community while offering a safe and enriching environment is key to our mission. We'd like to share with you the steps we're taking to offer our faith formation options for the next school year.

The most pressing questions on everyone's minds have been how and when will we return to campus? In order to determine the answers to these questions, the church has formed a task force to consider the many possibilities and to create a plan for safely reopening the campus. In addition to this core committee, other members of the community will be asked to lend their expertise and advice to us. We aim to be proactive in anticipating and meeting the needs of our families, catechists, core team and volunteers.

Since it will no longer be possible for all programs to congregate on campus on the same day, we are looking at offering each program on a different night of the week. This will eliminate the heavy foot traffic in our buildings and mass gatherings in the school, activity building and the church. Further,

some of our non-sacramental grades will consist of a homeschool program. It will also provide for social distancing utilizing all the available space on campus. Here's the proposed schedule:

PreK-K: Home school only

Grades 1 - 2:PREP - On Site on Monday evenings or Home School. CGS tbd

Grades 3 - 4: Home school only

Grades 5 - 6: Rock - On Site on Tuesday evenings

Grades 7 - 8: Edge - On Site on Wednesday evenings

Grades 9 - 10: Way - On Site on Sunday evenings

Grades 11 - 12: Apostello - tbd by small group leader

While we can't predict the future impact of COVID-19, the health and safety of our students, families, and volunteers is paramount. We will continue to make data-informed decisions based on the research, advice and regulatory protocols from the CDC, state and county health officials, and the Diocese of Raleigh. If conditions allow us to gather this fall, we will return to church prepared and committed to offering our parish community a healthy and safe environment.

In the coming weeks and months, you will be receiving updates on our progress to prepare for the fall semester, and we will share specific information about what you can do to register for our programs. For those families who are awaiting sacraments, we are working with our new pastor, while monitoring conditions, to arrange for the sacraments to be offered once it is safe to do so. These updates will be communicated through our e-newsletter as well as our program newsletters.

Dear STMM families,

STMM youth programs (Prep, The Rock, Edge, The Way & Apostello) have been looking for a way to help during this difficult time. Our own STMM Knights of Columbus have partnered with Wake County Human Services & several other local churches in the area to serve desperately needed meals to children, as well as the unemployed & underemployed in the Apex area during the COVID-19 crisis. They have set up an emergency food distribution site on Saturday and Sunday evenings located right here in Apex. In the first two weekends, they have served over 900 dinners in total to Apex residents who are in need. Their supplies and funds are running low and we'd like to humbly ask you to help out in whatever way you can during this time. We realize that not everyone is in a position to give goods or financial donations, and if that's where you find yourself right now please just join our efforts through prayer.

If however, you are in a position to help here are 2 ways we need you:

1) The KOC are putting together bags with a list of food items in them. There will be tubs located under the drive through portico on the chapel side of the church starting Monday until Thursday of each week. One tub will be labeled "Completed bags" and the other will be labeled "Bag items". If you cannot fill an entire bag, please just give what you can and we'll put bags together out of whatever we collect. This allows for a 'no contact' way to help out during this difficult time.

Here are the items for one completed bag:

- · 1 Rice or dried beans
- · 1 Pasta & 1 Small Canned Sauce
- · 1 Boxed Meal (hamburger helper or Mac-N-Cheese)
- · 1 Canned Vegetable
- · 1 Canned Fruit
- · 6 Snack Items (individually wrapped)
- · 1 Breakfast Items
- · 1 Hygiene Item
- · 1 Roll of Toilet Paper

Please bag these items at home and only include "like" items from above. We are not able to date

check the donations, so please fill these bags with in-date items we can hand directly to folks in need. Please make sure everything fits into ONE bag which can be double knotted!

We will keep this going over the upcoming weeks so if you can't participate this week, know you will have a chance in the weeks to come. This is a great family service project too and is an example of one of the corporal works of mercy to feed the hungry.


