

- 2. Ushers will be available with hand sanitizer and face masks are required.



Help Beautify the Campus



We need your helping hands again.

On THIS SATURDAY March 13th at 9am- we welcome you to the campus to help beautify the grounds. A lot got done on March 6, but more to be done.

We II be spreading more mulch on the grounds, and pine straw along the church perimeter, but also working on some new plantings, and cutting back some other areas to clear vines and old debris.

If you have tools like wheelbarrows, pitchforks, steel rakes, and also clippers, lopping shears, push brooms, shovels -- feel free to bring along with a pair of work gloves. Gas Leaf Blowers would be an extra help too, if you have as we'll use those to blow debris, leaves, and residual mulch off of parking areas.

Families and individuals are welcome. Many hands make for quick work!

There's no RSVP or Sign Up process. If your teen is in year 1 or year 2 of preparation you are required to attend 1 Parent Confirmation Workshop prior to your teen receiving the sacrament. We'll be in the gym where you can spread out on the bleachers. It is required for parents to wear a mask that covers the nose and mouth while you are on the STMM campus. The gym is on the first floor of the Activity Building.
