A Note From Father Donald Staib

Lent begins this week on Ash Wednesday. Masses at StMM are 8:15 am with the school children and at 7 pm.

On Fridays during Lent there will be Stations of the Cross in church at 7 pm. I am grateful that a group of people have come forth to lead the Stations.

Regarding the Bishop's Annual Appeal - last week we received \$5,569 from 24 new pledges. Thank you very much.

And - hooray for us! We have surpassed our goal by \$3,469. So far we have about 35% parish participation and \$194,796 had been given. All funds given/pledged over our goal come back to the parish. Ushers will not pass out pledge forms this week - the forms are in the pew. If you have not yet given, we welcome your help for the BAA and for our parish.

CONFESSIONS: In another part of the bulletin there is a schedule for Confessions at nearly parishes during Lent. At St Mary Magdalene there will be Confessions on Saturday March 2 at 10:30, after Baptisms, and on Saturday March 9 at 10:30.

Sacraments



BAPTISMS - See the Guidelines on the Website - then email the Pastor. First time parents must attend a baptism class [a good time is during the 9 months prior to birth.] Baptisms are usually, not always, at 10am on Saturdays or at weekend Masses.

CONFESSIONS - Always check the Pastor's Paragraph in the weekly Bulletin or our E-News mailed on Fridays. Confessions are usually, but not every week, at 10:30am on Saturdays in the Church.

WEDDINGS - See the Guidelines on the Website - then email the Pastor.

Reflection

Lent is a season for refocusing on the suffering and death of Our Lord Jesus Christ, so that we will be ready to embrace the good news of the Resurrection.

Why this emphasis on suffering? Because Christ saved us through an act of suffering. He bore in his own person the weight of our sin and died for us on the cross, where suffering and love coincided.

And the Church is the Body of Christ, which participates in Christ. Therefore, we shouldn't be surprised that we will be called upon to suffer out of love. In the economy of grace, God may use our suffering to bear the burden of another member of the Body of Christ, just as one system can take up the work of another, or one organ can support another.

So as we begin with Ash Wednesday, let us resolve to focus on Christ's suffering, and to unite our own suffering-through fasting, prayer, almsgiving, and reflection on the Stations of the Cross-with the suffering members of the Church. It is not the destination but the journey that will ultimately transform us.
