

are able to help, we have 2 ways you can help coming in the next couple of weeks. We've done them in years past but this year they look a little different(much like everything else in our world in 2020). So please help in whatever way you can.

1) This week is the last week you can drop off items for the Thanksgiving Baskets for Western Wake Crisis Ministries. 2) StMM Angel Tree will look a little different this year due to the Coronavirus. Huge thanks to Janet Overberg for organizing this for all of our programs: Gather, Edge, The Way & Apostello. We are still partnering with Friends of Wake County Guardian ad Litem, but all of our shopping will be done virtually. The agency has created gift registry links on various retailers' websites to shop for the children. These purchases will then be shipped directly to them, where they will wrap, label and deliver the gifts. They wanted to create a "virtual shopping experience", so there may be a couple of choices for a particular item. Example - 2 coat choices, or 2 tablet choices. ONLY 1 needs to be purchased! We will try to monitor this as best we can. The registries will be updated real time, but Janet will have to manually update the google documents. #### STMM Youth Ministry this Sunday, November 22 with the following schedule:

Apostello meets from 4:30pm-5:45pm. Each Apostello group has been assigned a point of entry/exit and will receive a temperature check at that door upon entry. Each teen must also wear a mask. Teens should check with their Apostello leader for their entry/exit door & room location.

The Way will be held from 7:15pm-8:30pm. Each small group has been assigned a point of entry/exit and will receive a temperature check at that door upon entry. Each teen must also wear a mask. This means that after youth mass, everyone must exit the church building before we can allow anyone to enter if their small group is assigned a room in the church building.

Teens should check with their small group leader(s) for their entry/exit door & room location.

Online registration is now open for teens who attend a Catholic HS & are seeking to receive the sacrament of Confirmation in April 2021. These teens are in year 2 of their preparation and would be in grades 10th-12th. This is "Option B" as explained on our Confirmation website at <u>www.stmm.net</u>. Parents should have already attended a Parent Confirmation Workshop and if you have not, it is required one parent attend the last of the 3 offered which will be on 12/1/2020 at 7pm in the school gym.

### IMPORTANT: PARENT CONFIRMATION WORKSHOPS ARE REQUIRED FOR A TEEN PREPPING FOR CONFIRMATION AT STMM:

If you have a teen who is currently in 8th/9th/10th/11th grade who is currently in year 1 or year 2 of Confirmation prep or a teen who will entering either year 1 or year 2 of Confirmation preparation at STMM in the 2021-2022 school year(meaning they would receive the sacrament in Spring 2022), please be aware that it is required by our parish that you attend a Parent Confirmation Workshop. We offer 3 of them every year and it is required that 1 parent attend 1 of the 3 sessions offered. Usually we offer them in the Spring and these have been moved due to us not being able to hold them last semester.
