

8th grade parents -

I know you are probably not thinking about high school just yet - or maybe you are. I need to share with you some super important information about your teen's next sacrament: Confirmation. Here at STMM we confirm at the end of 10th grade, usually. It is a TWO YEAR preparation program required by the diocese. The two years can be completed any time in their high school (or college/adult) career. Most folks do it freshmen/sophomore year. Because, who doesn't want the Holy Spirit renewed in their life asap?? Sign me up!

It is a parish requirement that you must attend ONE of the Confirmation Prep informational meetings in order to start the process. The meetings are for parents only. If your teen would like to be Confirmed at the end of their sophomore year, then you (parent) must attend one of these meetings while they are in 8th grade.

#### STMM Youth Ministry this Sunday, November 1 with the following schedule:

Apostello meets from 4:30pm-5:45pm. Each Apostello group has been assigned a point of entry/exit and will receive a temperature check at that door upon entry. Each teen must also wear a mask. Teens should check with their Apostello leader for their entry/exit door & room location.

The Way will be held from 7:15pm-8:30pm. Each small group has been assigned a point of entry/exit and will receive a temperature check at that door upon entry. Each teen must also wear a mask. This means that after youth mass, everyone must exit the church building before we can allow anyone to enter if their small group is assigned a room in the church building.

Teens should check with their small group leader(s) for their entry/exit door & room location.

# IMPORTANT: PARENT CONFIRMATION WORKSHOPS ARE REQUIRED FOR A TEEN PREPPING FOR CONFIRMATION AT STMM:

If you have a teen who is currently in 8th/9th/10th/11th grade who is currently in year 1 or year 2 of Confirmation prep or a teen who will entering either year 1 or year 2 of Confirmation preparation at STMM in the 2021-2022 school year(meaning they would receive the sacrament in Spring 2022), please be aware that it is required by our parish that you attend a Parent Confirmation Workshop. We offer 3 of them every year and it is required that 1 parent attend 1 of the 3 sessions offered. Usually we offer them in the Spring and these have been moved due to us not being able to hold them last semester.


The KofC are putting together bags with a list of food items in them. There will be tubs located under the drive through portico on the chapel side of the church starting Monday until Thursday of each week. One tub will be labeled "Completed bags" and the other will be labeled "Bag items". If you cannot fill an entire bag, please just give what you can and we'll put bags together out of whatever we collect. This allows for a 'no contact' way to help out during this difficult time.

Here are the items for one completed bag:

- · 1 Rice or dried beans
- · 1 Pasta & 1 Small Canned Sauce
- · 1 Boxed Meal (hamburger helper or Mac-N-Cheese)
- · 1 Canned Vegetable
- · 1 Canned Fruit
- · 6 Snack Items (individually wrapped)
- · 1 Breakfast Items
- · 1 Hygiene Item
- · 1 Roll of Toilet Paper

Please bag these items at home and only include "like" items from above. We are not able to date check the donations, so please fill these bags with in-date items we can hand directly to folks in need. Please make sure everything fits into ONE bag which can be double knotted!


