A Note From Father Donald Staib

This is the 4th week of our distant Mass, or Mass by live stream. We pray for all affected by the virus: those who are sick, their families and friends, the medical people who care for them and people who are not employed, and those confined to home. We older folks have no memory of such a pandemic; our children will have an experience to tell their children and grandchildren.

Today's Gospel is about St Thomas who did not understand what the other disciples told him. I have always been grateful to St Thomas; he had doubts about his world, and so do we. Included in this e-news is a picture of St Thomas the Apostle in our lobby.

It has been a few weeks since I mentioned the results of our 2020 Bishop's Annual Appeal. Since then I know the Diocese sent a reminder letter to members of the parish. This week I saw the current status of our parish BAA -- our goal is \$191,506.66 and we have received pledges of \$256,387. We are \$64,881 over goal and these funds will come back to the parish at the end of the year. Your support of our Diocese is outstanding this year.

We have been advised not to have Confessions during this time. Also, we must wait until we know how to proceed with Baptisms, First Communions, our RCIA group, and Confirmations. I know this is a cliche we say too easily - you are often in my thoughts and prayers.



Financial Matters




