A Note From Father Donald Staib

Many thanks to all who helped in 2 large parish events this past week: the Parish Mission and the Lent Penance Service. I am grateful to all who use their time and talents to help all our parish members.

Congratulations and Thanks to Parish Members We have reached our parish Bishop's Annual Appeal goal. We have received \$236,636 - 123% of our parish goal. We have received these gifts/pledges from 701 families, 35% of our 2,119 parish families. It would be wonderful to receive a pledge/gift from the remaining 1,418 families - envelopes are in the pews.

On a practical church note -- to minimize transferring a virus, we have stopped using the cup at Communion. Our Communion Ministers purify their hands when they come to the altar. If you prefer not to shake hands at Mass, you may bow to one another. In order to minimize touching another person's mouth, it would be helpful not to receive Communion on the tongue during this crisis.

Please see the <u>church website</u> for other precautions we are taking.

There will be no daily Mass and no communion service on Tuesday and Wednesday this week.

Confessions: There will be Confessions on Saturday March 14 at 10:30. There will also be Confessions on Saturday March 21, at 10:30.


Due to a power surge in Apex, the telephone system at StMM is not working properly. Technicians are currently installing a new system.

BAPTISMS - See the Guidelines on the Website - then email the Pastor. First time parents must attend a baptism class [a good time is during the 9 months prior to birth.] Baptisms are usually, not always, at 10am on Saturdays or at weekend Masses.

CONFESSIONS - Always check the Pastor's Paragraph in the weekly Bulletin or our E-News mailed on Fridays. Confessions are usually, but not every week, at 10:30am on Saturdays in the Church.

Reflection

Woman at the Well

- 1. She was a woman who went to the well at noon when the other women were gone from the morning task of getting water. If she went at noon she knew they would shun her. Who are people who are shunned today?
- 2. She was a woman in those days men and women never ever met in such a public place as the community well. What social/political walls of separation do we maintain in our time and culture?
- 3. Men did not go to the well at all because getting water was woman's work. Who now does the unappealing work?
- 4. She was a Samaritan, a group of people despised by religious people as half breeds and unworthy to worship at the Temple. Is there a group of people we exclude?
- 5. Her life was an embarrassment and a scandal no one welcomed such a person in their community. When they came back the Disciples were amazed Jesus was talking to her. She was a real sinner. Are there some sinners we will never forgive and accept?
- 6. Jesus crossed every human and cultural and religious boundary by talking to her. Even the woman was unsettled by Jesus asking her for a drink. Will we take a first step to converse, to begin a conversation, to start a negotiation?
