Reflection

THE MAN BORN BLIND

The story of the man born blind is more than a story of his blindness. The story also reveals the blindness of Jesus' disciples, the community, and the temple priests. The man's blindness is a state of being, not an ethical statement about his sinful behavior. Because of that, it is our story too, since blindness is a part of the human condition.

The passage is quite long and has many ironical twists. The blind man never asks to be healed, but Jesus heals him. Before he receives his sight, his life is difficult, but he is rather inconspicuous. Once he becomes sighted, his life becomes complex. He finds himself and his family at the center of a harsh temple dispute. Those who claim to have sight are blind.

The story is filled with questions and judgments. These are not just for us to observe, but also for us to answer and to resolve within ourselves. - Father Jude Siciliano, OP
