# Our 10:45am Mass is Live Streamed!

As all of us know, the State of NC is moving into Phase 1 restrictions as we come out of the COVID pandemic. With the governor's executive order, Worship services are permitted to resume in

outdoor settings for more than 10 participants. The Diocese of Raleigh released guidance to Pastors on last week to help ensure proper adherence to liturgical requirements while welcoming parishioners back to Mass.

At this time, we will continue our plans for the one Sunday Mass at 10:45am which will be live streamed via YouTube for our parish. We are moving forward with plans to resume Mass in the Church but will only do so in a safe, socially distancing manner. Some environmental modifications need to be made while supplies have to be ordered to ensure safety for all.

# **Resuming Sacraments of Confession and Baptism**

#### CONFESSIONS

This Saturday, May 16 I will resume Confessions at 10:30 am.

I will wear a mask and ask that you do the same.

If the weather is comfortable I will be outside in the piazza.

If weather is not favorable to outside -

- I will sit in a pew near the Baptism Font
- Penitent will sit in a chair
- Those waiting in line stay in the lobby until you turn
- Leave church after Confession

#### BAPTISMS

There are 31 awaiting Baptism and I can have only 1 family at a time. Maximum to attend is 9 people.

I will wear a mask when close to the child and parent who holds child should have a mask. Others who attend are encouraged to wear a mask.

At this time I can schedule a Baptism only through the month of June. Often Baptisms were at 10 am Saturdays, but there are few Saturdays available.

I can have Baptisms at other times. I suggest 4pm or 5pm on weekdays. Families can email me

**BAPTISMS** - See the Guidelines on the Website - then email the Pastor. First time parents must attend a baptism class [a good time is during the 9 months prior to birth.] Baptisms are usually, not always, at 10am on Saturdays or at weekend Masses.

**CONFESSIONS** - Always check the Pastor's Paragraph in the weekly Bulletin or our E-News mailed on Fridays. Confessions are usually, but not every week, at 10:30am on Saturdays in the Church.

WEDDINGS - See the Guidelines on the Website - then email the Pastor.

# Reflection

From the Pastor - I could not find a reflection this week. However, Pope Benedict wrote a long encyclical letter on the subject of Hope. Here is an outline of that letter. I am thinking about Hope because in these times we are in need of it and St Peter's Epistle this week has this thought: 'Always be ready to give a reason for your hope.'

#### Spe Salvi

(Saved in Hope), promulgated on November 30, 2007, is Pope Benedict XVI's second encyclical letter. It takes its name from Romans 8:24, *Spe salvi facti sumus* (in hope we were saved) and reflects on the theological virtue of hope.

The introduction links the Christian concept of hope to redemption through Jesus Christ. Articles 2-31 present a theological treatise with interspersed historical examples to highlight applications to the Christian's daily life. Articles 32-48 describe a series of contrasts to define Christ's role in and for society and its implications for Christians. Engaging in dialogue with philosopher, theologians, and political activists who have shaped history and promised mere immanent hope, Benedict notes that early Christian sarcophagi representations of Jesus as philosopher and shepherd illustrate that Christian hope extends beyond life on earth.

The encyclical closes with the chapter "Mary, Star of Hope".

Dear STMM families,

STMM youth programs (Prep, The Rock, Edge, The Way & Apostello) have been looking for a way to help during this difficult time. Our own STMM Knights of Columbus have partnered with Wake County Human Services & several other local churches in the area to serve desperately needed meals to children, as well as the unemployed & underemployed in the Apex area during the COVID-19 crisis. They have set up an emergency food distribution site on Saturday and Sunday evenings located right here in Apex. In the first two weekends, they have served over 900 dinners in total to Apex residents who are in need. Their supplies and funds are running low and we'd like to humbly ask you to help out in whatever way you can during this time. We realize that not everyone is in a position to give goods or financial donations, and if that's where you find yourself right now please just join our efforts through prayer.

If however, you are in a position to help here are 2 ways we need you:

1) The KOC are putting together bags with a list of food items in them. There will be tubs located under the drive through portico on the chapel side of the church starting Monday until Thursday of each week. One tub will be labeled "Completed bags" and the other will be labeled "Bag items". If you cannot fill an entire bag, please just give what you can and we'll put bags together out of whatever we collect. This allows for a 'no contact' way to help out during this difficult time.

Here are the items for one completed bag:

- · 1 Rice or dried beans
- · 1 Pasta & 1 Small Canned Sauce
- · 1 Boxed Meal (hamburger helper or Mac-N-Cheese)
- · 1 Canned Vegetable
- · 1 Canned Fruit
- · 6 Snack Items (individually wrapped)
- · 1 Breakfast Items
- ·1 Hygiene Item
- · 1 Roll of Toilet Paper

Please bag these items at home and only include "like" items from above. We are not able to date check the donations, so please fill these bags with in-date items we can hand directly to folks in need. Please make sure everything fits into ONE bag which can be double knotted!

We will keep this going over the upcoming weeks so if you can't participate this week, know you will have a chance in the weeks to come. This is a great family service project too and is an example of one of the corporal works of mercy to feed the hungry.
