Our 10:45am Mass is Live Streamed!

As all of us know, the State of NC is moving into Phase 1 restrictions as we come out of the COVID pandemic. With the governor's executive order, Worship services are permitted to resume in outdoor settings for more than 10 participants. The Diocese of Raleigh released guidance to Pastors on Thursday to help ensure proper adherence to liturgical requirements while welcoming parishioners back to Mass.

At this time, we will continue our plans for the one Sunday Mass at 10:45am which will be live streamed via YouTube for our parish. We are moving forward with plans to resume Mass in the Church but will only do so in a safe, socially distancing manner. Some environmental modifications need to be made while supplies have to be ordered to ensure safety for all.

Special Announcement

The Parish Finance Committee is pleased to announce that our Parish (Church and School) applied for and was awarded a Small Business Administration Payroll Protection Program Loan (SBA PPP) under the CARES Act that Congress authorized. We were guided by the Diocese officials to apply for this loan, due to the economic impact the Coronavirus pandemic is having on our operations. The conditions of this SBA PPP loan requires us to maintain all staff on payroll and keep them in full paid status, while also making our many obligations for all benefits (health, dental, life, disability) and funding the pension contributions for those staff.

This is a 'loan' only under this program. Our banking partner did affirm for us that the funds were 'set aside' for our Parish by SBA. We are still supplying documents for final underwriting and required justification of the loan.

This loan, in combination with actions taken by the Diocese to allow our parish (and all parishes) to forego certain monthly payments, and to defer [for 90 days] our significant debt obligations - has provided the Parish a 'lifeline' to work through this pandemic.

Your continued generosity in the electronic offertory, BAA collection, various on line giving opportunities, white envelope debt payments, educational tuition payments, and strong commitment for St. Mary Magdalene, is quite remarkable. Thank you for all that and we can only ask you to continue your support.

The Parish Finance Committee will be working closely with the School, Preschool, Program staff, and the Diocese to get through this budget cycle and to plan for the new budget year, which starts in July. The "unknowns" we all know are significant --- about how (and when) the health officials and government will permit re-opening of the campus, our Church, our School, our Programs, and our entire community.

We will come through this challenge, and come back stronger united in our commitment to our Parish and all of our community.

Dear STMM families,

STMM youth programs (Prep, The Rock, Edge, The Way & Apostello) have been looking for a way to help during this difficult time. Our own STMM Knights of Columbus have partnered with Wake County Human Services & several other local churches in the area to serve desperately needed meals to children, as well as the unemployed & underemployed in the Apex area during the COVID-19 crisis. They have set up an emergency food distribution site on Saturday and Sunday evenings located right here in Apex. In the first two weekends, they have served over 900 dinners in total to Apex residents who are in need. Their supplies and funds are running low and we'd like to humbly ask you to help out in whatever way you can during this time. We realize that not everyone is in a position to give goods or financial donations, and if that's where you find yourself right now please just join our efforts through prayer.

If however, you are in a position to help here are 2 ways we need you:

1) The KOC are putting together bags with a list of food items in them. There will be tubs located under the drive through portico on the chapel side of the church starting Monday until Thursday of each week. One tub will be labeled "Completed bags" and the other will be labeled "Bag items". If you cannot fill an entire bag, please just give what you can and we'll put bags together out of whatever we collect. This allows for a 'no contact' way to help out during this difficult time.

Here are the items for one completed bag:

- \cdot 1 Rice or dried beans
- · 1 Pasta & 1 Small Canned Sauce
- ·1 Boxed Meal (hamburger helper or Mac-N-Cheese)
- 1 Canned Vegetable
- · 1 Canned Fruit
- · 6 Snack Items (individually wrapped)
- · 1 Breakfast Items
- ·1 Hygiene Item
- · 1 Roll of Toilet Paper

Please bag these items at home and only include "like" items from above. We are not able to date check the donations, so please fill these bags with in-date items we can hand directly to folks in need. Please make sure everything fits into ONE bag which can be double knotted!

We will keep this going over the upcoming weeks so if you can't participate this week, know you will have

a chance in the weeks to come. This is a great family service project too and is an example of one of the corporal works of mercy to feed the hungry.
