- 2. 9:00 am Inside the Church, socially distanced, wearing face masks and hand sanitizing upon arrival
- 3. 9:00 am Virtual online with Outdoor Communion Service in Parking Lot <u>https://www.youtube.com/channel/UC7wpkWA5NgzXgQgmIxtNRZA?view_as=subscriber</u>
- 4. 6:00 pm Inside the Church, socially distanced, wearing face masks and hand sanitizing upon arrival

Mass Guidelines for Indoor Mass:

Church doors are locked when we reach capacity or Mass begins.

Please do not enter the church early so the staff can prepare for Mass.

Everyone should wear a facemask at all times.

Please be seated in designated sections only in pews with green check marks on the end of the row. Please do not sit in pews marked with red "X" as that indicates that pew is "closed" for seating. Please don't switch seats once you're in a designated pew.

Parishioners should sit socially distanced; at least six feet apart or one kneeler's length between families.



Pew Markers

Indoor Communion Procedures:

- 1. Please remain seated until the usher approaches your pew for communion.
- 2. As you leave your pew, hand sanitizer will be offered. If you cannot use hand sanitizer, please inform your usher who will arrange for you to be served at the end of communion distribution.
- 3. As you approach the Eucharistic Minister, notice the dots on the floor of the main aisle leading to the altar. Please advance from one dot to the next to remain socially distanced from others.

Please do not stand between the dots.

- 4. Please extend your arms fully in front of you towards the Eucharistic Minister with flattened hands to receive.
- 5. Once you receive the Eucharist, please step away from the Eucharistic Minister, remove your mask and consume the Eucharist. Replace your mask and return to the same pew you sat in prior to communion.
