As stated in previous bulletins, St. Mary Magdalene and Apex Funeral home are co-sponsoring pre-planning seminars. Members of the columbarium committee have attended this session and found it very informational on what considerations and decisions are needed to meet family needs during this very trying time.

Two sessions will be held in the Adult Room on May 18, 2017. One seminar starts at 11am and includes lunch; the other starts at 6pm and includes dinner.
