Reflection

The Story of Our Lady of Lourdes in France

On December 8, 1854, Pope Pius IX proclaimed the dogma of the Immaculate Conception. A little more than three years later, on February 11, 1858, a young lady appeared to Bernadette Soubirous. This began a series of visions. During the apparition on March 25, the lady identified herself with the words: "I am the Immaculate Conception."

Bernadette was a sickly child of poor parents. Their practice of the Catholic faith was scarcely more than lukewarm. Bernadette could pray the Our Father, the Hail Mary and the Creed.

During interrogations Bernadette gave an account of what she saw. It was "something white in the shape of a girl." She used the word *aquero*, a dialect term meaning "this thing." It was "a pretty young girl with a rosary over her arm."

Through that humble girl, Mary revitalized and continues to revitalize the faith of millions of people. People began to flock to Lourdes from other parts of France and from all over the world. In 1862 Church authorities confirmed the authenticity of the apparitions and authorized the devotion of Our Lady of Lourdes. The Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes became worldwide in 1907.

WHAT IS FOCUS?

FOCUS (Fellowship Of Catholic University Students) is a Catholic collegiate outreach whose mission is to share the hope and joy of the Gospel with college and university students. Trained in the Church's teaching, prayer, sacred Scripture, evangelization and discipleship, FOCUS missionaries encounter students in authentic friendship, invite them into personal relationship with Jesus Christ and accompany them as they pursue a life of virtue and excellence. Through Bible Study, outreach events, conferences, mission trips, and one-on-one discipleship, missionaries help students encounter Christ, encourage and build students in the faith, and send them out to spread the Good News and live out the Great Commission: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations (Mt 28:19)."



The need is great, 80% of practicing Catholic go to college and leave the faith before graduting and only 20% return to the faith. The Church needs people on the college campus who can help students live out their faith and take it to the workplace
