A Note From Father Donald Staib

We continue this weekend to ask for support for our Bishop's Annual Appeal. So far we have received pledges of \$91,124 from 291 households in our parish. Perhaps we are on our way to a record for our BAA. We are at the 17% level of parish family participation. And we have reached 48% of our parish goal of \$191,507. Many thanks to generous givers, and we look forward to hearing from all the parish.

Please consider a pledge of \$187 over a six month period. \$32 per month - the Diocese will send you a reminder each month.

ABOUT BAPTISMS: Ash Wednesday is February 14. We do not have baptisms during Lent, so the next opportunities will be after Easter. I do have baptisms at the Easter Sunday Masses.

CONFESSIONS: There will be Confessions on Saturday February 3, after Baptisms but no Confession on February 10. We will shortly publish a schedule of Lent Penance Services in our area.

Thank you for the gifts last week in the 2^{nd} collection for the church in Latin America; we received \$2,838.

In our lobby we recently placed an American flag and the Papal flag. The American flag will be placed in the worship space on significant national holidays. These flags are a gift to the parish from our Knights of Columbus - for which we are most grateful.

During this season of flu and colds - use good judgment about using the Communion cup and giving the handshake of peace.
