Mass This Weekend

There are three options for attending Mass this Sunday.

1. 9:00 am Inside the Church, socially distanced, wearing face masks and hand sanitizing upon

- arrival
- 2. 9:00 am Virtual online with Outdoor Communion Service in Parking Lot https://www.youtube.com/channel/UC7wpkWA5NgzXqQqmIxtNRZA?view_as=subscriber
- 3. 6:00 pm Outside the Church in the rear parking lot near Columbarium

Mass Guidelines for Indoor Mass at 9am:

Church doors will be locked when capacity is reached or Mass begins.

Everyone should wear a facemask at all times.

Please be seated in designated sections only in pews with a green check marks on the end of the row.

Please do not sit in pews marked with red "X" as that indicates that pew is "closed" for seating. Please don't switch seats once you're in a designated pew.

Parishioners should sit socially distanced; at least six feet apart or one kneeler's length between families.



Pew Markers

Indoor Communion Procedures:

- 1. Please remain seated until the usher approaches your pew for communion.
- 2. As you leave your pew, hand sanitizer will be offered. If you cannot use hand sanitizer, please inform your usher who will arrange for you to be served at the end of communion distribution.
- 3. As you approach the Eucharistic Minister, notice the dots on the floor of the main aisle leading to the altar. Please advance from one dot to the next to remain socially distanced from others.
 - Please do not stand between the dots.
- 4. Please extend your arms fully in front of you towards the Eucharistic Minister with flattened hands to receive.
- 5. Once you receive the Eucharist, please step away from the Eucharistic Minister, remove your mask and consume the Eucharist. Replace your mask and return to the same pew you sat in prior to communion.

Mass Guidelines for Outdoor Mass at 6pm:


Please do not arrive before 5:30pm as the back parking lot will not open until then Please park in the spaces in the FRONT of the church

Bring your own chair & walk around to the back of the church

Every other parking spot will be open for you to place your chairs in. This will allow parishioners to sit socially distanced

Communion Procedures for Outdoor Mass:

- 1. Please remain in your parking spot until the usher & Eucharistic Minister approach your spot for communion. The EM's will move up and down the parking rows, please stay put.
- 2. The usher will give everyone in your parking spot hand sanitizer. If you cannot use hand sanitizer, please inform your usher who will arrange for you to be served at the end of communion distribution.
- 3. As you approach the Eucharistic Minister, please extend your arms fully in front of you towards the Eucharistic Minister with flattened hands to receive.
- 4. Once you receive the Eucharist, please step to the side away from the EM, remove your mask and consume the Eucharist. Replace your mask and return to your chair.



- · 1 Roll of Toilet Paper

Please bag these items at home and only include "like" items from above. We are not able to date check the donations, so please fill these bags with in-date items we can hand directly to folks in need. Please make sure everything fits into ONE bag which can be double knotted!




2020 Parish Survey Results - Installment 4 of 4

Thank you to everyone who participated in or assisted with the 2020 Parish Survey which was conducted in the spring of this year. We received a fantastic response from **211 members of the Parish!** We'd like to share some of the results with you over the course of the month of September, and tell you more about what we'll be doing with this data. Please note that the data collected and presented here is only a sample of the parish.

- Respondents who provided their contact information and expressed interest in a particular adult ministry have been contacted by the respective leaders of that ministry.
- A summary of the data specific to current members and parishioners interested in each existing adult ministry has been shared with the ministry leaders.
- The survey data has been shared with Father Chris and the Parish Council.
