<u>Sacramental Preparation - Frequently Asked Questions</u>

When are the Sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Eucharist offered?

Children are eligible for their sacraments after completing two years of faith formation typically in the first and second grade. In the second grade, the sacraments of First Reconciliation are offered in the winter and First Eucharist is offered in the spring. Regular attendance is required for proper preparation. A parent workshop is held to explain both the sacrament of First Reconciliation in the fall and First Eucharist in the spring.

What if my child was baptized but has not received their sacraments and they are past the second grade?

The Diocese of Raleigh requires that a child needs to have two full years of faith formation in order to receive the sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Eucharist. Children will be registered with their grade level peers in years one and two. During year two, they need to attend a class called Intermediate Sacramental Preparation, which teaches First Reconciliation and First Eucharist.

Year one and year two could begin in any of the following programs:

Gather (grades 1-4) The Rock (grades 5-6) The Edge (grades 7-8) The Way (grades 9-11) Apostello (grades 11-12)

Are there fees associated with receiving a sacrament?

A materials fee of \$75 is charged to children preparing to receive the sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Eucharist. The fee covers the cost of two workbooks, two retreats and all the supplies purchased to use in their formation. It is an additional fee collected and paid at the time of registration. Scholarships are available based on need.
