May we open our hearts and minds to receive his word with faith; may our fellowship born in one font of baptism and sustained at the one table of the Lord, become the one temple of his Spirit, as we gather round his altar in love.

PROCESSION TO THE NEW CHURCH

#### Refrain

I rejoiced when I heard them say, "Let us go to the house of the Lord. Let us go to the house of the Lord."

At the threshold of the church the procession comes to a halt. Representatives of those who have been involved in the building of the church hand over the building to the Presider, offering him the keys and the plan of the building. The Presider then calls upon the pastor of the parish to open the door. When the door is unlocked, the Presider invites the people to enter the church.

#### BLESSING AND SPRINKLING OF WATER

When the entrance rite is completed, the Presider blesses water with which to sprinkle the people as a sign of repentance and as a reminder of their baptism, and to purify the walls and the altar of the new church. The Presider invites all to pray.

#### Presider

Brothers and sisters in Christ, in this solemn rite of dedication, let us ask the Lord our God to bless this water by His hand.

It is a sign of our repentance, a reminder of our baptism, and a symbol of the cleansing of these walls and this altar.

May the grace of God help us to remain faithful members of His Church, open to the Spirit we have received.

All pray in silence for a brief period. The Presider then continues:

God of mercy, you call every creature to the light of life, and surround us with such great love that when we stray you continually lead us back to Christ our head.

For you have established an inheritance of such mercy, that those sinners, who pass through water made sacred, die with Christ and rise restored as members of his body and heirs of his eternal covenant.

Bless # this water; sanctify it. As it is sprinkled upon us and throughout this church make it a sign of the saving waters of baptism, by which we become one in Christ, the temple of your Spirit.

May all here today, and all those in days to come who will celebrate your mysteries in this church, be united at last in the holy city of your peace.

We ask this in the name of Jesus the Lord.

When the invocation over the water is finished, the Presider, accompanied by the deacons or servers, passes through the main body of the church, sprinkling the people and the walls with the holy water; then, when he has returned to the sanctuary, he sprinkles the altar.

We invoke the Saints of the Church and ask them to pray for our intentions. These Saints who have gone before us join with us who are living to offer our prayer to God as one true Body of Christ.

Let us ask the saints to support our prayers to God the Father almighty, who has made the hearts of his people faithful temples of his Spirit.

#### Presider

#### ANOINTING OF THE ALTAR AND WALLS OF THE CHURCH

The Presider anoints the altar by pouring sacred chrism in the middle and on each of the four corners then rubbing it into the entire top. The Presider anoints the walls by signing them with chrism. The chrism is a blend of olive oil and balsam that was blessed by the Bishop during the Chrism Mass on Holy Thursday. It is used for the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Orders as well as for the blessing of sacred places and things. This anointing consecrates the altar and building forever and reminds us of our own dedication to Christ by the seal of the Holy Spirit.

#### Presider

We now anoint this altar and this building. May God in His power make them holy, visible signs of the mystery of Christ and his Church.

#### INCENSATION OF THE ALTAR AND THE CHURCH

The Presider comes to the altar and prepares the gift of incense. A brazier (for burning incense) is placed on the altar and the Presider inserts the incense. He puts the incense in the censer and incenses the altar, returns to the chair, is incensed, then sits. The pastor processes through the church incensing the people and walls. Malachi 1:11 states that in every place incense shall be offered up to God. Incense has been used throughout the history of the Church as a prayerful offering to God, a sign of our prayers rising to Heaven.

Lord, may our prayer ascend as incense in your sight. As this building is filled with fragrance so may your Church fill the world with the fragrance of Christ.

#### LIGHTING OF THE ALTAR AND THE CHURCH

The altar is wiped clean and ministers begin to prepare it for the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass by dressing it with the altar cloth. The candles used for the Mass are arranged on the altar and the Presider hands a minister a lighted candle with instructions to light them. The festive lighting of the church takes place with all the candles being lit as a sign of rejoicing. The altar is the primary symbol for Christ and the symbol of light directs us to Christ who is the Light of the World.

#### LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

The ministers prepare the altar. Members of the assembly bring forth the bread, wine, and water for the celebration which are received by the Presider. The celebration of the Eucharist is the principal and most ancient part of the Rite of Dedication. The Eucharistic sacrifice achieves the end for which the church was built and the altar erected. It sanctifies the hearts of those who receive it and consecrates the altar and this place of celebration. "This altar should be an object of awe . . . it is made holy when it receives the body of Christ" (John Chrysostom, Homilia 20 in 2 Cor. 3 pp 61, 540).

#### GUIDELINES FOR THE RECEPTION OF COMMUNION

# FOR CATHOLICS

As Catholics, we fully participate in the celebration of the Eucharist when we receive Holy Communion. We are encouraged to receive Communion devoutly and frequently. In order to be properly disposed to receive Communion, participants should not be conscious of grave sin and normally should have fasted for one hour. A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord without prior sacramental confession except for a grave reason where there is no opportunity for confession. In this case, the person is to be mindful of the obligation to make an act of perfect contrition, including the intention of confessing as soon as possible (*Code of Canon Law*, canon 916). A frequent reception of the Sacrament of Penance is encouraged for all.

#### FOR OUR FELLOW CHRISTIANS

We welcome our fellow Christians to this celebration of the Eucharist as our brothers and sisters. We pray that our common baptism and action of the Holy Spirit in this Eucharist will draw us closer to one another and begin to dispel the sad divisions which separate us. We pray that these will lessen and finally disappear, in keeping with Christ's prayer for us "that they may all be one" (John 17:21). Because Catholics believe that the celebration of the Eucharist is a sign of the reality of the oneness of faith, life, and worship, members of those churches with whom we are not yet fully united are ordinarily not admitted to Holy Communion. Eucharistic sharing in exceptional circumstances by other Christians requires permission according to the directives of the diocesan bishop and the provisions of canon law (canon 844 § 4). Members of the Orthodox Churches, the Assyrian Church of the East, and the Polish National Catholic Church are urged to respect the discipline of their own Churches. According to Roman Catholic discipline, the Code of Canon Law does not object to the reception of communion by Christians of these Churches (canon 844 § 3).

#### FOR THOSE NOT RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

All who are not receiving Holy Communion are encouraged to express in their hearts a prayerful desire for unity with the Lord Jesus and with one another.

#### FOR NON-CHRISTIANS

We also welcome to this celebration those who do not share our faith in Jesus Christ. While we cannot admit them to Holy Communion, we ask them to offer their prayers for the peace and the unity of the human family.

# **OUR HISTORY**

In 1997, Bishop Joseph Gossman, responding to requests from many parents in southwest Wake County for Catholic Schools, appointed Father Donald Staib to begin a new parish in Apex. The Bishop indicated the first task for Father Staib was to work with Father William Schmidt, and then later Father David Fitzgerald, pastors of St. Andrew the Apostle Catholic Church in Apex, and Father John Wall, pastor of St. Michael the Archangel Catholic Church in Cary, to build new Catholic elementary schools.

In 1997, the priests and committees of lay people began to work with architects to design the buildings, establish curriculum and guidelines for the schools, form a search committee for two principals, and make a study to determine the potential number of children who might attend the schools. The next task was to raise funds for the construction; the campaign was called "Campaign 2000." Ground was broken for two new schools on June 6, 1999. One school was built on the campus of St. Michael, and the second school became the first building for St. Mary Magdalene Parish and School.

When it came time for groundbreaking, a name was needed for the new parish. Father Staib had asked various individuals and groups in the Catholic community for suggestions; there were no strong contenders proposed. The pastor himself strongly favored names from the Bible and suggested Mary Magdalene to the Bishop. There are no other Catholic churches in North Carolina with this name.

In the New Testament, Mary Magdalene is mentioned four times; she was healed by Jesus of an affliction, she and other women supported Jesus and the Apostles in their ministry, she stood with Jesus' mother at the cross, and she was the first witness to Jesus' Resurrection. Because she took the news of the Resurrection to the Apostles, she is often called "Apostle to the Apostles."

All other information about Mary is legend; an excellent book about Mary Magdalene (which includes information on how the legends grew over the past 2000 years) is Susan Haskins' *Mary Magdalene: Myth and Metaphor*. It was a New York Times Notable Book of the Year in 1993.

In keeping with this background, the street address for the parish is Magdala Place; Magdala is the town in the Holy Land on the Sea of Galilee from which Mary Magdalene came.

Meanwhile St. Mary Magdalene Parish began to hold Sunday Mass at Apex Middle School. The first Mass was celebrated on September 12, 1999. Our parish theme song was, "Sing to God a simple song; make it up as you go along." On December 5, three months later, a second Sunday Mass was added.

Cannon Architects was chosen to design a master plan for the site, which included several phases, some of which were adjusted as the parish moved forward.

The new building for classrooms and offices was completed, and Bishop Gossman came to bless the St. Mary Magdalene campus at the first Masses offered at the present site on Sunday, August 13, 2000. The Saturday Mass at 5 p.m., was added to the schedule on October 14.

# OUR HISTORY (cont.)

St. Mary Magdalene School opened on September 5, 2000, with an enrollment of 330 students in grades Pre-K through 8th grade. It was a unique experience for the students: they had never been in the building before, never met their teachers or administrators, and many had never worn school uniforms before. It did not take long for children to get used to their new surroundings.

The school was ready for them. The principal, Bob Cadran, had worked for the previous year to hire faculty, order desks and equipment for the school, and watch over the final process of the school construction.

St. Mary Magdalene School – like St. Michael School – was governed by a Board appointed by the three parishes that support the two schools.

The colors of the parish and school are burgundy and gray with gold accents, and the mascot is the monarch butterfly. The athletic teams prefer the short form of Monarchs.

In 2001 Bishop Gossman announced a major capital campaign called "God's Work, Our Challenge" to raise funds for Diocesan needs. Parishes were invited to join the campaign for their own needs, and St. Mary Magdalene took that opportunity to raise funds for a second building, which would include a gym, dining hall, some classrooms, and a chapel.

Construction began in January 2003 and the first Masses in the gym were the weekend of August 21 and 22, 2004. There were sufficient seats for more than 1,100 people; the children seemed to prefer sitting in the bleachers where they could easily see the altar. Bishop Gossman came to bless the new building on September 19, 2004. Two additional classrooms for the school were added in 2009–2010.

In September 2011 Bishop Michael Burbidge announced plans for a new Cathedral in Raleigh. The diocese initiated a Cathedral campaign to raise funds for its construction. The Cathedral campaign meant that St. Mary Magdalene had a choice to make: either take up free will pledges for the Cathedral funds with the proviso that we could not conduct our own capital campaign for three years, or piggy-back our campaign for construction funds with the Diocese's campaign while meeting an assigned Cathedral fundraising goal. St. Mary Magdalene was seeking to raise funds for church construction at the same time as the Diocese.

Our Parish Council recommended that we join with the Diocese, and the parish began to plan with Cannon Architects and Clancy & Theys Construction Company to design the new church building.

In December 2011 we learned of two stained glass windows of St. Mary Magdalene: one at the Resurrection and one of her as a young woman. The windows were from two closed churches — St. Peter and St. Paul—both in Troy, N.Y. The windows were about 125 years old and were designed by the famous firm Franz Mayer of Munich, Germany. In the window set were four other windows and a Rose Window. Within one week members of the parish offered to purchase the windows, and later the Knights of Columbus offered to pay for the Rose Window.

# OUR HISTORY (cont.)

During his 2012 summer trip to Vietnam, Father Staib learned of a studio in Ho Chi Minh City – still called Saigon by the people – where wooden statues were carved by young men with hearing disabilities. He began a process of working with this studio to create statues and Stations of the Cross for our new church. He also knew of marble studios in Da Nang, Vietnam, and he asked them to design two angels for the Columbarium. The faces of these two angels are the same faces as the angels in our Fontanini Christmas figures.

In August 2012 the parish began its capital campaign called "Our Church, Our Time." The remainder of 2012 and all of 2013 were spent raising funds for the church, organizing committees to research and seek advice on all aspects of construction, and meeting with architects and experts to plan for the infrastructure of the building. Fifteen listening sessions were scheduled to hear feedback from members of the parish and to ask for financial commitments.

On the fourth Sunday of Advent, December 22, 2013, Bishop Burbidge came to bless the new church site. In addition, parish members used 1,500 bottles of Holy Water to sprinkle the site.

The years 2014 and 2015 were filled with preparations for construction: meeting with Diocesan Committees, the Town of Apex, and architects to review proposals; meetings with our own Building Committee and working to raise sufficient funds. It was a steady, on-going process. During this time we also developed our parish e-news to send construction progress updates once a week.

Construction finally began in January 2016. An initial and important step in the construction of a church is the establishment of the future location of the altar. The altar faces east. Once the altar position is established, the church is built around its location. On January 17, 2016, after all the Masses, we took a cross and ribbons emblazoned with the names of parishioners into the woods to the altar site. We fastened the ribbons to the cross. The cross now resides in our lobby until we can move it to the new church building. A month of rain and mud followed, so initial ground movement was slow.

St. Mary Magdalene is most grateful to all of its members and those in the parishes of St. Andrew and St. Michael who contributed to "Campaign 2000" for an outstanding beginning. Generous gifts and pledges to the "Our Church, Our Time" campaign made the church construction possible.

We are also grateful to the members of the parish staff and school staff who have served with talent and dedication. There are thriving programs in our school, in our faith formation program, and for our youth, as well as a parish athletics program that serves the community. The hard work of our own support staff keeps all of these activities coordinated.

This written history is a story mostly of buildings. A far more wonderful story is the community of people who come to St. Mary Magdalene for worship and for service. We have made up so much "as we went along," and it is wonderful and gratifying to behold.

LITURGICAL REFLECTIONS AND OUR CHURCH

#### ORIGINAL CONCEPT

The first idea for our church design was the number **eight**. As the day of Christ's Resurrection, Sunday came to be understood in a mystical way among Christians as the "**Eighth** Day." Jesus rose on the **eighth** day and St. Mary Magdalene was the first to encounter the Risen Lord. Our church nave is a square, one-half of **eight**. The dome is an **octagon**; the dome is centered over the entire congregation to emphasize the worship of our entire community — priest and people. The baptismal font is an **octagon**, and the altar is an elongated **octagon**.

#### **ALTAR**

It takes millions of years for granite and marble to form. There are many beautiful designs and the stone comes from many countries. Our intent was to use stone from Argentina in honor of Pope Francis. There is stone in that country, but it is rarely exported, and after several months of trying, we had to turn to the more available granite from Brazil. So our altar is made of Giallo Siena Extra Granite from South America—in honor of Pope Francis. Our baptismal font is constructed from the same granite.

#### **TABERNACLE**

Our tabernacle is from Spain. It was purchased in 2000 to be used as the tabernacle that would go with us as we grew. At first it was in a classroom we used as a chapel, and then it was moved to the chapel in the Activity Building. Now it is in its permanent home in our church. On the top of the tabernacle is a Celtic cross which matches the cross on our church dome.

# CRUCIFIX, STATUES, AND STATIONS OF THE CROSS

These items were carved from Po Mu wood at the Huu Thao Sculpture Workshop in Saigon, Vietnam by hearing disabled young men. It is the first time this studio has made items for any church in the United States. Father Staib first saw the work of these young men in a friend's church in Saigon. In 2013 he commissioned the statues for our new church.

#### STAINED GLASS WINDOWS

These windows became available back in 2011 from two closed churches in Troy, N.Y.—St. Peter Church and St. Paul Church. Each of the original windows from the two churches was cut into three parts, and the parts are displayed in various places around the new church. The four windows on the wall are from St. Peter Church. They depict the Baptism of Jesus, Jesus Appearing to St. Mary Magdalene, the Annunciation, and the Woman at the Well. They were installed in St. Peter's beginning in 1887. From St. Paul's, we purchased the St. Peter's Window in the center behind the altar, the Rose Window, and the St. Mary Magdalene Window in the chapel. These windows were installed in St. Paul's beginning in June of 1890. The eight panel portion over the altar in the chapel will use some of the pieces of the original windows that were not used elsewhere.

STAINED GLASS WINDOWS (cont.)

All these windows were the first items purchased for the new church. With the enthusiasm and generosity of several members of the parish and the Knights of Columbus, we quickly brought them to North Carolina. All were refurbished by Artistic Impressions of West End, N.C. The windows originally were designed over 125 years ago by the famous firm Franz Mayer of Munich, Germany. Monsignor Michael English, who was once a pastor at St. Peter, is the uncle of Father Paul Bryon, a dear friend of our parish.

#### ENTRY LOGO

"And when Jesus had dismissed the crowds, he got into the boat and came to the district of Magdala." (Matthew 15:39). The entry logo is a symbolic representation of a first century fishing boat of Magdala, the town on the Sea of Galilee and the home of Mary Magdalene. In 1986 the hull of a fishing boat was found in the lakebed near the ancient port of Magdala. The boat has been called the "Jesus boat" because it is old enough to have been in use during the time of Christ. Excavations at Magdala have recently uncovered the oldest first century synagogue. Many people believe Jesus may have taught there.

#### CORNERSTONE

The cornerstone shows the year of the dedication of the church and the words, "Apostle to the Apostles," a title given to St. Mary Magdalene around the 10th century. As expressly wished by Pope Francis, the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments published a new decree, dated June 3, 2016, which noted: "since she was an eyewitness to the Risen Christ, she was also the first to testify before the apostles which calls upon us to reflect more deeply on the dignity of women, the new evangelization and the greatness of the mystery of divine mercy."

#### COLUMBARIUM SMALL ANGELS

The two angels who will watch over our Columbarium were designed and fabricated by Utlan Stone in Da Nang, Vietnam. They come from a place called Non Nuoc near China Beach. It is a long way from Vietnam to Italy, but if you look carefully you will see that the faces of these angels match the faces of two of the angels in our parish Nativity made by Fontanini. One of the Nativity angels and one of the Columbarium angels each hold a bird. The bird is Yoleeta. Yoleeta first belonged to Father Staib's mother, but now she lives with Father Staib. The local children love to come and visit her.

#### CHAPEL CRUCIFIX AND MADONNA AND CHILD

These gifts to the parish came from Father Paul Byron, a deceased member of our clergy. It was reported that they originally were from a Redemptorist priest's house in Charlotte.

#### BELL TOWER ROOSTER

It is a tradition to put roosters on church domes or bell towers. In the 800's Pope Nicholas I issued a decree that all churches must display the rooster; the decree has not been rescinded. In the Gospel of Matthew Jesus said to Peter, "Amen I say to you, this very night before the rooster crows, you will deny me three times." Pope Nicholas thought that this symbol of Peter's betrayal of Jesus would help remind us of our own fragility and our capacity to sin—like Peter, we can betray Jesus or betray one another. After the Resurrection there is a sequel to the rooster event when Jesus asked Peter three times, "Do you love me?" As we can betray, so can we repent. A serious betrayal may last forever, but it does not have to.

#### CHAPEL DOME BUTTERFLY

Since 2000 our parish and school have used the butterfly as a logo. The butterfly is a symbol of Jesus' resurrection. As a butterfly comes out of its chrysalis, so Jesus came forth from His tomb. Mary Magdalene was the first witness to this event when she thought Jesus was the gardener. Our school mascot is the monarch butterfly, but our athletic teams simply use, "Monarchs."

#### NORTH AND SOUTH WINDOWS

There are 16 blank windows that line the sides of the nave. They are from unused portions of the stained glass used in the church and chapel. On each window sill, the name of an Old Testament book is etched in glass as a placeholder. For another time in the future, for another creative moment, and for another budget, we hope to tell the story of the Old Testament using these windows.

#### PROCESSIONAL CROSS

Our processional cross features genuine cloisonné, fire-enameled scenes representing the life of Christ. It has a wooden pole and gold-plated fittings. This cross was made in Spain. It was a gift from the children who attend St. Mary Magdalene faith formation classes and the students who attend St. Mary Magdalene School.

#### **RELICS**

St. Damien

St. Damien was a Belgian missionary priest. He was born in 1840, and in 1863 he came to Hawaii. In 1873, he requested to work among the lepers at Molokai. He organized burial details and funeral services to return dignity to lepers when they died. He taught the people how to grow crops and feed themselves better. He organized a choir and persuaded people to sing who had not sung in years. He provided needed medical attention, personally washing, anointing, and bandaging the lepers' sores. In contrast, the government doctors made regular visits, but they avoided all contact with the patients because they were afraid of contagion. The doctors inspected the lepers' sores from a distance, and then they left medicines on a table and fled. The chapel on the island was too small, so with the help of the patients, he built a larger one. The new chapel overflowed every Sunday. Damien contracted leprosy himself in 1885, and continued to work there until his death on April 15, 1889.

#### St. Martin de Porres

St. Martin de Porres (1579-1639) was the illegitimate son of a freed woman of color of Panama and a Spanish grandee of Lima, Peru. Martin inherited the features and dark complexion of his mother. That disappointed his father, and it took him eight years to acknowledge his son. After the birth of Martin's sister, the father abandoned the family. Martin was reared in poverty and trapped at the bottom of Lima's society. When he was 12, his mother apprenticed him to a barber-surgeon. He learned how to cut hair and also how to draw blood (a standard medical treatment at the time), care for wounds, and prepare and administer medicines. After a few years in this medical apostolate, Martin applied to the Dominicans to be a "lay helper," not feeling himself worthy to be a religious brother. But after nine years as a lay helper, the example of his prayer and penance, charity, and humility led the community to request him to make full religious profession and become a priest. Many of his nights were spent in prayer and penitential practices; his days were filled with nursing the sick and caring for the poor. He cared for all people regardless of their color, race, or status. He was instrumental in founding an orphanage, took care of slaves brought from Africa, and managed the daily alms of the priory with practicality as well as generosity.

#### St. Kateri Tekakwitha

The blood of martyrs is the seed of saints: Jesuits Isaac Jogues and John de Brébeuf were violently martyred by Iroquois warriors in Auriesville, New York. Nine years later, a baby girl was born nearby. Her mother was a Christian Algonquin. When she was four, Kateri lost her parents and little brother in a smallpox epidemic. She was adopted by an uncle who succeeded her father as chief. Kateri was moved by the words of three visiting Jesuits, and at 19 she finally got the courage to take the step of converting. Her conversion and holy life created great opposition in her tribe, and Kateri was treated as a slave and lived in danger. For three years she grew in holiness under the direction of a priest and an older Iroquois woman. She gave herself totally to God in long hours of prayer, in charity, and in strenuous penance. She and two friends wanted to start a religious community, but the local priest dissuaded her. Instead, she humbly accepted an "ordinary" life. She was beatified in 1980 and canonized in 2012.

# PIAZZA STATUE OF JONAH

The Jonah story from the Old Testament is presented in bronze by Shelley Kolman Smith of the Flying Paint Ranch Sculpture Studio in Poetry, Texas. She is also the creator of the statue of St. Ignatius at St. Raphael in Raleigh. Shelley has portrayed one episode in the life of Jonah. The Scripture texts around the base tell more of the story. Father Staib claims that the story of Jonah is the story of his life. He has preached many sermons to persuade the members of St. Mary Magdalene that it is the story of their lives, too.


