

A Note from Father Francis

HOLY SATURDAY AND SILENCE

I deliberately use SILENCE, not necessarily as absence of sound, but as**STILLNESS**. "**BE STILL, AND KNOW THAT I AM GOD!**" Psalm 46:10. Thus, silence is a deliberate spiritual effort to create space for an encounter with God, and in my mind, I consider Holy Saturday as a spectacular model of this silence/**stillness**. By this, allow me to draw your focus and attention.

Holy Saturday is a day of profound silence, the day between the death and resurrection of Jesus; a time of complete quietness, symbolizing also the complete silence of the tomb where Jesus' body lay. Reinforced by the liturgical discipline of contemplation and prayer, the absence of Holy Mass and the bare altar, I pray that it translates for each one of us into the silence that will permeate through our true inner selves, and connect us with the sorrows and bewilderment of the disciples who grappled with Jesus' death. I pray more that each one of us looks at oneself and accepts his/her feebleness, and thus deliberately creates this **stillness**, permitting God to look into our life squarely and fix the missing links.

Friends, we need the Holy Saturday experience in order not to fail God in completing His work in our lifetime. The world, otherwise, is going bizarre because of the lack of such experience. Let us yearn for such experience to appreciate our own single need for God in our daily life and help us also to await the joy of our Easter/resurrection at the end of our earthly journey.

I pray to you, our God and Father, that we be ensued by your Spirit to experience that stillness, and humble our sinful pride that pervades over our earthly accomplishments. Help us to use every opportunity to serve you among our fellow men and to the glory of your name. Amen.


