

A Note from Father Mike

Have you ever wondered why humanity strays away from God? We see the cause of this tracing back to Adam and Eve's sin. Their straying actions impacted the whole world. Many people go throughout their lives not caring about God, salvation, or eternity. They concern themselves with everything other than God and His ways, yet all were created by God and for God, all were created out of love for love.

In the first reading this weekend, Jeremiah confronts the people of Israel with tough and challenging words. "Cursed is the one who trusts in human beings, who seeks his strength in flesh, whose heart turns away from the LORD... Blessed is the one who trusts in the LORD... he is like a tree planted beside the waters... it fears not the heat when it comes... in the year of drought it shows no distress."

Have you ever wondered what Jeremiah might say, if he was passing through our land? We see in our culture mottos like, "He who has the most toys wins" or "Capitalism is the way to glory" or "Socialism - you will own nothing, and you will be happy." I believe none of these mottos would satisfy the prophet Jeremiah. He would probably say, where is God in any of them.

One of our country's historic mottos is "*E Pluribus Unum*", which translates to "*Out of Many, One*". It was adopted by Congress around 1782. Then in 1956 Congress adopted an additional motto "*In God, We Trust*." We can see these mottos on our currency. It seems our land over the years has strayed from its original mottos. It seems many in our country now follow, "In hard work, I trust... In self, I trust... In science, I trust... In Netflix, I trust." So, what mottos do we follow in our daily life?

Heavenly Father, we thank you for speaking to us through Your prophet Jeremiah. Your Word instructs us, comforts us, and guides us, showing us the way. We know that You have given us many gifts and blessings. We also know that we need Your help and guidance. Please strengthen us to trust You, and to believe Your Word more deeply. Help us to understand that Your way is always the best, even if there are some hardships for a time. Protect us from the false wisdom of the world, the false wisdom of the flesh. Help us to believe in You who are all good and loving to all Your children.






