

A CHRISTMAS NOTE FROM FATHER MIKE

It is hard to believe that Christmas is just around the corner. This weekend, we hear the Christmas story recorded in Matthew's Gospel, not Luke's. Luke's gospel is told from Mary's perspective, while Matthew's gospel is told from Joseph's perspective. Both gospels are about the same miraculous birth, but they emphasize different things. Like any mom or dad that were to tell the story of their child's birth, they each would emphasize different things. So what are some of the things that Joseph's account teaches us about the miracle of Christmas?

First, Joseph's account reminds us of the surprise of Christmas. We can often think that Christmas comes in a very orderly and predictable way, yet the first Christmas was anything but orderly, and expected. When Mary was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit, Joseph was completely caught off guard. I suspect that nothing could have shocked him more. I think Joseph may have been counting down the days to his wedding. He may have had the big day circled on his calendar. It completely upended his plans, and ultimately changed his entire life in a wonderful way.

Second, Joseph's account reminds us of the miracle and true gift of Christmas. Even though Joseph was told by the angel to name their son Jesus, yet there is another name given to Jesus that is equally important. It is the name, Emmanuel, which means, "God is with us." Christmas is a gift showing us that God is with us. There is one thing that we can always count on, which is, God chooses to be with us throughout our lives. No matter what unpredictable events take place in our lives, God promises to be there guiding, comforting, and helping us to take the next step in God's plan for us.

Third, Joseph's account reminds us of the mission of Christmas. I think the world can use more people like Joseph, who are kind, considerate, truthful, and filled with integrity. More people who want to join Jesus in his mission to bring joy to all the world. More people who want the world to know that God is here with us. That is one of the missions of Christmas. So, during this Christmas time, let that beloved Christmas carol, "Joy to the World" always spring forth from our hearts.


