

A NOTE FROM DEACON DEV

Advent is a season of hope. This was symbolized by the lighting of the first candle in our Advent Wreath this last weekend. In a world often darkened by despair, Advent reminds us that the light of Christ has already overcome the darkness. And so, whatever are our circumstances, we are a people of hope because we know that our lives and our future are in the hands of a God who loves us.

Derived from the Latin word *adventus*, meaning "arrival" or "coming," Advent is a season of spiritual expectation that focuses on three specific arrivals of Jesus Christ. First, we look back to the greatest event in human history – the Incarnation. We call this the **Past or First Coming of Jesus**. This is what we will celebrate with great joy at Christmas. Second, we look forward with hope to the end of the age when Jesus will come back again. We call this the **Future or Second Coming of Jesus**. Third, we also pay attention to the present. Jesus continually offers to come into our lives each and every day. We call this the **Present Coming of Jesus**.

Advent is also a season of preparation. We go through great efforts to prepare decorations, cookies, family celebrations, and presents. But the most important thing we need to do this season is to **prepare ourselves** so that we are ready to meet Jesus at any time whether it's when his Second Coming happens or when we are called from this life to the next. Many of us will have special guests visiting our homes this season and we will make sure that we are ready for them. But, what if one of those guests turned out to be Jesus? Would he find us ready to meet him?

Meaningful preparation leads to meaningful celebration. If you take the time to truly wait, hope, and prepare, you will find that when Christmas morning finally arrives, you won't just be opening presents - you will be worshipping the King who has come to save.

Advent is also a season of peace. This will be symbolized by the lighting of the second candle in our Advent Wreath this coming weekend. Let us pray that during this season, we will all experience the peace of the Risen Christ.


