

A NOTE FROM DEACON DEV

This weekend we celebrate the baptism of the Lord. It seems fitting to celebrate this just after the new year begins because both of these things are about beginnings. Jesus' baptism in the River Jordan was the beginning of his public ministry and for many of us, the new year represents a new beginning. This is why making new year resolutions is so popular. We sense that there is a gap between who we are and who we know we should be. The new year then becomes an opportunity to make some much needed changes in our lives. However, as sincere as we are, it soon becomes obvious that on our own we cannot fill this gap.

Baptism reminds us that we don't need to. We have died to ourselves, and our new life – the life we currently live – is in Christ. Paul says in Romans 6:4,8: "We were indeed buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life ... If then, we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with him." Ultimately, Christ is the one who transforms us into who God created us to be. 2 Corinthians 3:18 states: "we are being transformed into his image with ever-increasing glory, which comes from the Lord." And so, every day in Jesus is a new life, a new year, a new day.

And so, where should our focus be? On getting to know Jesus more. Each year, I use this time to do an important reflection. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states that we have been created to know, love, and serve God. And so, each year I ask myself, "Do I know, love, and serve God more than I did a year ago?" If my answer is "Yes", then I've grown spiritually over the last year. But if my answer is "No" or "I don't know" then I haven't grown spiritually.

And so, as we begin this new year, let us reflect then on what we can do differently this year **to know, love, and serve Jesus more.** So often we can be so fixated on what we consider to be sacred that we discount everything else. The Pharisees had such strong opinions about how the Messiah should act that they completely failed to recognize Jesus even in the midst of them. Let us be more open this year to the possibility that Jesus may want us to discover him in newer, deeper, and unexpected ways even if it means moving out of our comfort zones.
