A Note from Father Francis Xavier

LIFE IN GOD

I am filled with much hope and peace from the Advent and I pray that Joy fills you as the third candle of our Advent wreath burns brightly.

My brothers and sisters, allow me drag you a bit back to the Immaculate Conception. First of all, God plans for every life by conception time and ordains it a purpose right away. God in His omniscience, planned to give new life to the world that was fallen when Mary was conceived in the womb of her mother (Anne). He, therefore, preserved her from the stain of original sin at the very first moments of her existence (the Immaculate Conception). This should remind us of how God wanted to keep His original plan of a human race free from sin just like at the creation of Adam and Eve. He also never wanted to destroy His original work and to equally keep his initial command ".....be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth and subdue it...." Gen 1:28.

Relatedly, God, continues to restore His creation through Mary whose YES to the Will of God - fiat mihi secundum verbum tuum- "Let it be done according to your word"

(ANNUNCIATION 25th/March) when her turn to conceive of the baby Jesus came. This YES of Mary introduces us to something new, that is the need for human free will and acceptance to collaborate with God before, during and after conception. I also seem to read some silent tone that once conception occurs, life and its divine purpose is present, and so Man/woman has no option but to seek Divine wisdom in supporting the remaining processes for proper growth and development of this new life.

Profusely, otherwise, God, initiates life and man/woman is expected to cooperate with Him to bring its proper purpose to actualization.

Every conception counts in the eyes of God, in Jer 1:5, He says "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you......and consecrated you.....".

I invite you to ponder upon the Divine will before involving in processes that may result into conception and so prepare to uphold life immediately after conception.

I pray that no human life from natural conception to natural death be mistreated or be taken less important and may the nativity of Christ comfort all who mourn the loss of their babies.

Then come join Deacon Rick and your fellow parishioners for a dynamic six-week series that will enhance your daily spiritual life.


We typically get a small group of participants together for what is more discussion and less lecture.




Are you an adult interested in becoming Catholic? Are you wanting to participate fully in the sacraments instituted by Christ? Are you a baptized Christian and desiring to
