A Note from Father Mike

In this weekend's reading from Isaiah, we hear the theme of "Comfort." God seeks to comfort his people who have been dealing with their exile from Jerusalem to the Babylonian empire. They had done many things over the years that displeased God and the exile was like God's disciplinary "timeout." We hear in the previous chapter of Isaiah about King Hezekiah of Judah, making prideful and bragging statements to the visitors from Babylon about all the great things they have in Judah. "Hezekiah was pleased at their coming, and then showed the messengers from Babylon his treasury, the silver and gold, the spices and perfumed oil, his whole armory, and everything in his storerooms; there was nothing in his house or in all his realm that Hezekiah did not show them." By his bosting, he showed his adversaries all their hidden secrets.

The prophet Isaiah and King Hezekiah did not always see eye to eye. Isaiah confronts his bragging with some hard and devastating words. Basically, the Jewish people had turned away from God, so everything will be carried away to Babylon. Their rebellion toward God has caused them devastation. Their lack of faith has led to their ruin. Yet, despite all the hardships and challenges the Jewish people had endured in their exile, God still loves them and seeks to comfort them. Through the prophet Isaiah, the people hear that God's purpose is not their destruction but their redemption.

We too may also experience many struggles and challenges. Despite all of this, we should never forget what St. Paul tells us. He says, "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and God of all comfort." Always remember that God desires to save, not to destroy. God desires our redemption, so let us prepare by humbling our hearts for the Lord. Seek his help in removing any obstacles that may hinder us from truly trusting in him. Let us believe and trust in God's never failing love for us, despite any setbacks we may encounter each day.




Are you an adult interested in becoming Catholic? Are you wanting to participate fully in the sacraments instituted by Christ? Are you a baptized Christian and desiring to


