# Gabriel Project Ministry



This time last year, we announced a new ministry at St. Mary Magdalene- Gabriel Project Ministry, which reaches out to expectant mothers in our community. The Holy Spirit is blessing

many women in Wake County. Thank you for your generous support of baby items, handmade blankets and cash which has made this possible. In less than one year, Gabriel Project Ministry has been walking alongside 14 women and 6 of whom had their babies. Similar to Jesus sending out disciples two by two, we pair caring StMM volunteers to partner and walk alongside mothers and their families providing loving support and attention to the mom during her pregnancy and up to one year of the baby's birth. Additionally, we connect moms to other local organizations to meet their other physical needs (such as groceries, rent assistance, payment of utility bills). Currently we have 12 angels and need more!


