

A Note from Father Mike

Can you believe we are now in the month of August? Where has this summer gone? As you may know, I am up in MI visiting family. These cool evenings up here have been a nice blessing. I wish I was able to send some of these cool evenings to the Carolinas. I went to Mass this past Sunday at the "Cross in the Woods" shrine in Indian River, MI. Their summertime Masses are held outside, weather permitting. The cross is 55 feet tall, and it is the second largest crucifix in the world. A statue of Saint Kateri Tekakwitha is near the outside altar. She is looking back towards the large cross. She was an important influence on the building of the large cross because of her habit of placing small crosses in the forest as places to stop and pray.

Our Heavenly Father loves each and every one of us and personally takes care of us like He did with St. Kateri Tekakwitha. His concern is beyond our understanding. The readings this weekend invite us to have proper priorities in our lives and invite us to place our trust in God. The Book of Ecclesiastes teaches us how to find meaning in life in the times of joy as well as in the times of suffering. It helps us to understand and prioritize things in life.

This weekend's Gospel teaches us about greed and that life does not consist in the abundance of possessions. The rich man's possessions give him false security and evidence to feel he has total enjoyment of life. Yet fear and insecurity plague his soul, making him search for earthly relief. The rich man in the story was a fool not because he was wealthy but because he thought that he could guarantee his own personal security through the hoarding of his harvests without placing his trust in God. This man had wrong priorities. The first was that he never saw beyond himself. He was extremely selfish. The man's second wrong priority was that he never saw beyond this world. His whole basis of security was in his possessions.

Our Lord places an invitation before us to not focus on treasures of this world but to build treasures in heaven. The lessons from this weekend's readings are obvious. To be in this world and not of it, to collect the necessary goods of this world by honest labor, to remain detached from them, and to possess and not to be possessed by them.


