

A Note from Fr. Mike

This Monday we celebrate Labor Day. This holiday is when much of the country celebrates: a day off from work, the last hurrah of summer, plenty of sales in stores and online, lots of barbequing, and for those people who are hard core into fashion, no more wearing white after Labor Day.

During Labor Day, I sometimes think of the movie, "Lilies of the Field" which was made in the 1960s. In it, Sidney Poitier plays Homer, a man, a jack of all trades who stumbles upon a community of nuns in the desert of Arizona.

Mother superior, who leads the sisters, convinces Homer to repair their leaking roof. Expecting to be paid for his work, and not getting paid, he starts a strong wage discussion with the headstrong mother superior by citing Luke, "For the laborer deserves his payment." Mother superior's rebuttal cites Matthew, "Learn from the way the wildflowers grow. They do not work or spin. But I tell you that not even Solomon in all his splendor was clothed like one of them." The tension between the two of them is at the heart of the movie. Yet, when we think about it, both characters are right. Homer completed his job and deserved to be paid. But the lilies of the field (the sisters) perform an important job every day and ask for nothing: They are content to just be.

Labor Day should be a time for us to relax and reflect. To reflect on our own work, and on the work of those around us. This Labor Day, and possibly every day, offers us an opportunity where we can give thanks for work by saying a prayer for all those who work and especially for those who work in hazardous conditions. Let us pray that our own work, insignificant as it may seem, and those of others, might somehow go toward building a more just world.


