

A Note from Father Mike

Lent offers us the opportunity to face more bravely, the complexity of our human struggles. It is a time to face any darkness within and surrender it to the light of Christ. In the first reading this weekend, we hear from Genesis. At the heart of it is God's promise to Abraham, which is, "Look up at the sky and count the stars, if you can. Just so, shall your descendants be." God's promise runs through the whole Bible and forms the basis of God's interactions with humanity. God chose Abraham to be the father of faith to the future Jewish nation. Even after Abraham believed God, his faith was filled with questions.

In a way, Abraham is just like us as we journey along in this Lenten season. Believing but questioning, trusting but doubting, looking for certainty in the midst of life's struggles. So, what does God do when our faith questions him in our times of struggle? He calls us to faith by repeating his promise, rather than being angry with Abraham's questions, God reassures him that his promises will come true.

As God challenged Abraham, he learned with certainty that God always keeps his promises and he is present in the dark times of our lives. Many of us know what it is like to begin a walk with God, as Abraham did. In the beginning our walk with God may have been sweetness and light. Then things happen that throw our lives into turmoil. We have gotten sick, or lost a loved one, or faced financial ruin, or seen our children walk away from God, and we began to struggle with our faith. We may question God in the dark times, just like Abraham did.

When we surrender to God in these times of struggle, we are not ignoring a situation or being passive. God is waiting for us to act, to use our God-given gifts, just as we are waiting for God to act. He has given us gifts, and we are empowered to use them. Some of the greatest gifts God gives is faith, prayer, trust, and perseverance. When we do our part, working through our struggles together with God, by using our gifts and his grace, it can help us to understand things a little more clearly.

This Lenten season offers us the opportunity to come closer to God. Let us ask him to grant us grace and strength to persevere through our times of struggle. Let us always remember that God loves us and he always journeys with us. Speaking words of encouragement to his beloved children like, do not be afraid, for I am your shield, and your very great reward.




