

A Note from Father Mike

Happy Fourth Sunday of Easter... In this weekend's readings we see the beginning of Paul's missionary journey. It is important to note that Paul and Barnabas did not begin this journey based on their own ideas. They were called by the Holy Spirit to this work. The church had fasted, prayed, laid hands on them and sent them on their way. They did not have success in every place they preached. Far from it, for they were run out of Antioch of Pisidia. In shaking the dust off their feet, they were saying they did not want to take anything of that city with them. They did not take the rejection from the people of the city personally, and they did not doubt God's mission for them. They just moved along to the next town.

Often, when we feel called to do something for God, we may begin with stars in our eyes. We think that if God has called us to do something, then we will have nothing but success. Then when resistance comes, or when we experience what we interpret as failure, we withdraw from the work, thinking that we must have misinterpreted God's call.

I think there is a good life lesson here. When we try to do what is God's will, what is right, just, and true, what is morally good, we should expect resistance. We may ask ourselves "Why" does this happen if we are trying to do God's will? We need to keep in mind that the enemy does not want the works of God to advance. We are in a spiritual battle when we are laboring in God's vineyard. An important thing to remember is that we are not in the battle alone. If God has called us, he is with us. And if he is with us, if he is on our side, if he is for us, who can be against us? In other words, it does not matter if we have opposition, because God's purposes will always prevail in the end. We should persevere in our Christian faith despite challenges and temptations. Remember what St. Paul said, "fight the good fight of faith". Sure, there may be struggles and setbacks, but those are the times when we should rejoice like the apostles, because it is then that we have confirmation that we are on the right track.
