

A NOTE FROM DEACON DEV

Our gospel reading this weekend reminds us that God loves a thankful heart. Jesus heals ten lepers but only one of them, a non-Jew, returns to thank him. Jesus asks him, "Where are the nine?" His question has a note of sorrow and surprise. It grieved Jesus that the nine did not return to give him thanks. There is a sad answer to this rhetorical question: they got what they wanted and were gone. Unfortunately, it's the common response to divine mercy. People seek the Lord when they have a need, and they often forsake him when that need is met. Jesus rewards this non-Jew with a healing that went beyond just the physical. He tells him, "Stand up and go; your faith has saved you."

The Psalmist says that being thankful opens the door to God's blessings. However, we have to train our hearts to be thankful. We are all familiar with the hymn that says, "Count your blessings, name them one by one." When we recall each and everything God has done for us, we focus on what we *do* have, rather than letting our lives be defined by what we *don't* have. And so, instead of complaining or coveting, we are joyful because we know that our lives and future are in the hands of a loving God who wants to take care of us. Giving thanks to God keeps our hearts in right relationship with him and saves us from a host of harmful emotions and attitudes that will rob us of the peace that God wants us to experience.

A grateful heart sees each day as a gift. Thankful people focus less on what they lack and more on the privileges they have. The grateful heart is like a magnet sweeping over the day, collecting reasons for gratitude. Gratitude gets us through the hard stuff. Gratitude always leaves us looking at God and away from dread.

Like many of you, I watched the video this weekend during Mass of the proposed Family Life Center. As someone who is involved in parish life, I am well aware of how grossly inadequate our meeting space is for a parish of this size that is still growing. I am very excited about the plans for a large parish hall and additional conference rooms! Thank you to all those who have already completed their pledges and to everyone else for your continued prayer and discernment.




